AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$508,030.00 IN GRANT FUNDING FROM THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY ("FEMA") FUNDED THROUGH THE FLOOD MITIGATION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM, THROUGH THE OF FLORIDA, DIVISION OF **EMERGENCY** STATE MANAGEMENT ("FDEM"), TO FUND THE ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5123 MARTHA ANN DRIVE, JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA 32207 (RE# 133973-0140) AND THE DEMOLITION OF THE RESIDENTIAL STRUCTURE LOCATED THEREON, AS INITIATED BY B.T. 24-040; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY, TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE (THE "CITY") THAT CERTAIN FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBAWARD AND GRANT AGREEMENT NUMBER B0205 BETWEEN THE CITY AND FDEM; AMENDING THE 2024-2028 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2023-505-E TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE PROJECT ENTITLED "ACQUISITION AND DEMO OF A FLOODPRONE PROPERTY - MARTHA ANN DRIVE"; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT ΒY JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS DIVISION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents a Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant Program ("FMAGP") award in the amount of \$508,030.00 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") through the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management ("FDEM") for completion of the flood hazard mitigation project described in this Ordinance. No City match is required.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to fund the acquisition of that certain property identified by the FEMA National Flood Insurance Program as a "Severe Repetitive Loss Property" located at 5123 Martha Ann Drive, Jacksonville, Florida 32207 (RE# 133973-0140), (the "Property") and to fund the demolition of the private residential structure located thereon, including removal of foundation slabs and debris on the Property, as approved by FDEM and FEMA in accordance with the FMAGP (the "Project"). Upon completion of the Project, the Property will be converted to green space and will become subject to a perpetual space conservation easement, in accordance with open FEMA requirements. All activities associated with the Project shall be completed in strict compliance with federal, state and local rules and regulations. The term of the grant, and period of performance,

shall begin upon the City and FDEM's execution of that certain Federally-Funded Subaward and Grant Agreement Number B0205 (the "Grant Agreement") and shall end on September 25, 2026.

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Agreements. There is hereby approved, and the Mayor, or her designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, the Grant Agreement in substantially the same form as placed On File with the Office of Legislative Services, and any respective extensions or amendments thereto as necessary and appropriate to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance.

Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance Section 4. 2023-505-E, adopting the 2024-2028 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reflect this appropriation of funds to the project entitled "Acquisition and Demo of a Floodprone Property - Martha Ann Drive." This project is more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay urgently-needed mitigation of this floodprone Property and the safe removal of residents from the immediate dangers of flooding. The Property is located in an area that is subject to persistent nuisance flooding and the Project will reduce future costs to the county, state and federal agencies that provide evacuation and rescue, emergency shelter, and debris removal services in the area.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP
