ORDINANCE 2024-198

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 CATEGORIES OF MOST VULNERABLE PERSONS AND NEEDS FOR PUBLIC SERVICE APPROPRIATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, AND ESTABLISHING A RECOMMENDED FUNDING AMOUNT FOR THE MICRO-GRANT PILOT PROGRAM; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Public Service Grant Council met on February 12, 2024, to approve the fiscal year 2024-2025 categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs; a copy of the minutes of said meeting is attached hereto as Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, having considered the recommendation of the Public Service Grant Council, hereby establishes the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs for the 2024-2025 fiscal year; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs Pursuant to Section 118.804 (Categories of Most Established. Vulnerable Persons and Needs), Part 8 (Public Service Grants), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, the following categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs, as recommended by the Public Service Grant (PSG) Council in the letter attached hereto as Exhibit 2, are hereby established for the 2024-2025 fiscal year:

2024-2025 Categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs

- 1. Acute. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 30%.
- 2. Prevention and Diversion. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 40%.
- 3. Self-Sufficiency and Stability. The percentage of available funding allocated to this category shall be 30%.
- 4. Micro-Grant Pilot Program. The PSG Council has requested that this Pilot Program receive \$200,000 from the total funding allocated to the PSG Council for fiscal year 2024-2025. The funds awarded to the PSG Council for fiscal year 2024-2025 that are remaining after this allocation to the Pilot Program will be split amongst the Acute, Prevention and Diversion, and Self-Sufficiency and Stability categories in the percentages provided above.

Detailed definitions of each of the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs are set forth in **Exhibit 3**.

Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Public Service Grants made by the City Council shall be used to exclusively serve the categories of Most Vulnerable Persons and Needs. Where a category contains more funding than applied for, the excess funding for that population may be applied to another category that contains less funding than applied for. Where more than one category has fewer funds than applied for, the excess funding shall be divided among the underfunded categories on a percentage basis where the total amount underfunded in all underfunded categories is the denominator and the amount underfunded in any one category is the numerator.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
