WHEREAS, Sam Mousa attended Florida Junior College and later earned his bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Florida College of Engineering in 1976; and

WHEREAS, in 1987, Sam Mousa's career path led him to Jacksonville City Hall, beginning as an engineer in the Department of Public Works under Mayor Hazouri's administration. He elevated through the ranks of city government, was the Director of Public Works under Mayor Ed Austin, the protégé of the esteemed Lex Hester, and Mayor Delaney's Chief Administrative Officer who managed the nuts and bolts of the \$2.2 billion Better Jacksonville Plan; and

WHEREAS, Sam Mousa returned to the private sector, serving as the Executive Vice President of J.B. Coxwell Contracting, Inc. and managing principal with JBC Planning & Engineering, LLC, before making his way back to city government when asked to serve as Mayor Curry's Chief Administrative Officer until his retirement in 2019; and
