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## ORDINANCE 2024-44-W

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS) ORDINANCE CODE; TO RE-NAME WEAVER ROAD EXTENDING FROM AVENUE "B" TO A DEAD END AS "CHARLIE E. MCCLENDON ROAD" IN COUNCIL DISTRICT 8; RECOGNIZING THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF CHARLIE E. MCCLENDON; WAIVER OF SECTION 745.105 (I) (2), ORDINANCE CODE, WHICH REQUIRES THAT THE HONOREE BE DECEASED FOR AT LEAST FIVE (5) YEARS; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD THIS ORDINANCE TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR PROCESSING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND COORDINATION WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, TRAFFIC ENGINEERING DIVISION, 911 EMERGENCY, FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, THE POST OFFICE AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Addressing Division, of the Planning Development Department, received an application to re-name "Weaver Road" to "Charlie E. McClendon Street" in honor of Minister Charlie E. McClendon who has served the Jacksonville area for more than 50 years; and

WHEREAS, in 1973, Minister Charlie E. McClendon became the pastor of Northside Church of Christ located at Almeda Street; and WHEREAS, under Minister McClendon's leadership, church attendance increased causing the need for a new church building; and

WHEREAS, Minister McClendon, on behalf of the Church, purchased vacant land located at 4736 Avenue B, and constructed a church sanctuary, an educational building and a family life center on the property; and

WHEREAS, as church membership continued to grow, the surrounding neighborhood received the greatest benefit having Minister McClendon as the lead pastor at Northside Church due to his strong connection and presence in the community; and

WHEREAS, the motto of Northside Church of Christ is "Love Will Keep Us Together"; and

WHEREAS, Minister Charlie E. McClendon is responsible for saving many souls and close to 500 members at the Church; and

WHEREAS, the Church runs several ministries for youth, women, girls, boys, married couples, singles and seniors; and

WHEREAS, the Church has run a summer camp program since 1982 which serves children of working families requiring childcare during summer school breaks; and

WHEREAS, annually, in November, the church holds a Community Day and Fish Fry and gives away food to approximately 300 attendees; and

WHEREAS, there are so many more charitable programs run by the Church including a clothing closet and back to school Rally giveaways; and

WHEREAS, Minister Charle E. McClendon accepts numerous speaking invitations and travels, nationwide, to conduct workshops and seminars to numerous Church of Christ parishioners on the subjects of church growth and development; and

WHEREAS, in 1997, Minister Charlie E. McClendon formed Northside Community Involvement, Inc., a non-profit corporation where its primary mission involved providing resources to families living within a three-mile radius of the Church; and

WHEREAS, the Northside Community Involvement, Inc., proudly,

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offers programs such as: a full daycare center for infants and afterschool care, adult literacy classes, GED programs, Empowerment Conferences and many others; and

WHEREAS, Northside Community Involvement partners with United Way and Feeding Northeast Florida due to Minister McClendon's leadership; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his remarkable and unwavering contributions to Northside Church of Christ Church and Northside Community Involvement, Charlie E. McClendon has received a number of awards and recognitions; and

WHEREAS, Minister McClendon has been awarded recognition and awards for: Grand Park Community services rendered, 2007 Cambridge Who's Who Executive Professional Entrepreneur Lifetime Membership, 1996 ILA Local 1408 Award, 2013 SDDC Military Surface Deployment and Distribution, Certified Leader of Family Dynamics Institution Seminars; and

WHEREAS, Minister McClendon was honored in 2006 and 2015 with Resolution 959-A for the Working to Improve Neighborhoods (WIN) program, and Resolution 678-A for 42 loyal years pastoring Northside Church of Christ; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Times-Union recognized Minister McClendon's
40 years of service at Northside Church of Christ; and

WHEREAS, City of Jacksonville former Mayor John Peyton proclaimed May 29, 2013 as "Charlie and Ida McClendon Day;" and

WHEREAS, the street name change from "Weaver Road" to "Charlie E. McClendon Road" affects the address assignment of eight (8) property owners; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ordinance Code, the Planning and Development Department mailed written notifications on August 15, 2023, and on September 15, 2023, to the affected property owners requesting the affected property owners to indicate

their written consent or objection to the proposed street re-naming.

A copy of the first and second written notifications are attached as

Exhibit 1 and Exhibit 2; and

WHEREAS, initially, the owner of three properties objected to the street re-naming, but later consented after receiving a third letter from the Planning and Development Department and additional information about the street re-naming. A copy of the initial objection, the third letter and consent are attached as Exhibit 3, Exhibit 4 and Exhibit 5; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 745.105 (j)(10), Ord. Code, the remaining affected property owners are deemed to have consented to the proposed street re-naming due to their non-response to the written notifications. A copy of the spreadsheet of affected property owners is attached as Exhibit 6; and

WHEREAS, on September 6, 2023, the 911 Emergency Addressing Advisory Committee reviewed the street name request and voted to accept the Staff Recommendation to re-name "Weaver Road" to "Charles E. McClendon Road". A copy of the minutes of the September 6, 2023, public meeting of the 911 Emergency Addressing Advisory Committee is attached as Exhibit 7; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2023, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission ("JHPC") voted to adopt the Staff Report with a recommendation for approval to re-name "Weaver Road" to "Charlie E. McClendon Road". A copy of the JHPC agenda, Staff Report and the excerpt minutes of the September 27, 2023 public meeting of the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission are attached hereto as Exhibit 8 and Exhibit 9; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has remitted the payment required for the street name change. A copy of the payment receipt and invoice is attached as Exhibit 10; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds it appropriate to change "Weaver

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Road." Weaver Road extending from Avenue B to the dead end is hereby re-named as "Charlie E. McClendon Road" by which name such street and physical location shall be hereafter known and designated. A copy of the map of "Charlie E. McClendon Road" is attached hereto as Exhibit 11.

Section 2. Waiver of Section 745.105 (i)(2), Ord. Code. Section 745.105 (i)(2), Ord. Code which requires that the honoree be deceased for at least five (5) years is waived because the proposed street name of "Charlie E. McClendon Road" is long overdue for the honoree.

Section 3. Directing Legislative Services to forward a copy to the Planning and Development Department. The Chief of Legislative Services is requested to send a copy of this legislation, once enacted, to the Planning and Development Department, Addressing Unit, for processing, implementation, and coordination with 911 Emergency, Fire and Rescue Department, the Post Office, Public Works Department, Traffic Engineering Division and other affected agencies organizations.

Effective Date. This ordinance shall Section 4. effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
