# Report of the Historic Preservation Section and Advisory Recommendation of the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission

DATE: August 27, 2025

At the request of City Council, legislation will be introduced to propose naming the City-owned building located at 620 Bay Street E as the "Henry Bradley Firefighters Museum." Consistent with Chapter 122.105 of the Jacksonville Ordinance Code the naming and renaming of public buildings, public facilities and public parks, requires a Report from the Historic Preservation Section and an advisory recommendation on the renaming proposal from the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission. The Report is required to address the following criteria:

- 1. The origin of the existing public building, public facility, or public park name, if applicable;
- 2. Any historical significance of the existing public building, public facility or public park;
- 3. Whether there are any historical structures or landmarks on the subject property
- 4. Whether the existing building name, name of public facility, or public park name is part of a common theme of names throughout the community where such building, park or facility is located;
- 5. The age of the public building, public facility or public park name
- 6. Whether there are other public buildings, public facilities, or public parks with the same or similar name; and
- 7. Whether the person (or persons) to whom the public building, public facility or public park is proposed to be named or renamed has contributed to the development of, or is a reminder of the history and/or culture of the City, State, or Nation.

**Location:** 620 Bay Street E, RE# 073354-0000

**Reason for Change:** At the request of City Council to honor the life and legacy of Henry J. Bradley, volunteer firefighter for the City of Jacksonville, by naming the City-owned firefighters museum building located at 620 Bay Street E as the Henry Bradley Firefighters

Museum." Firefighter Bradley was the first City of Jacksonville firefighter to die in the line of duty.

### Criteria:

1. The origin of the existing public building, public facility, or public park name, if applicable:

Constructed approximately ten months after the Great Fire of May 3, 1901, the existing City-owned building was originally used as a fire station ("Catherine Street Fire Station #3") for African American firemen who worked out of the station until 1905. After being saved from demolition in 1972, the Catherine Street Fire Station was later rehabilitated to house the Jacksonville Fire Museum. Due to its large valuable collection of firefighting related artifacts and documents, the Catherine Street Fire Station was designated in 1982 as the official museum of the Florida State Firefighters Association by the Florida State Firemen's Association. After continued loss of the surrounding historical context and endangered from nearby construction, the Catherine Street Fire Station was moved in 1994 to the Kids Kampus at Metropolitan Park. It was later moved to its present-day location in 2022. The museum is currently closed for renovations in coordination with the proposed Jacksonville Shipyards West Park.

2. Any historical significance of the existing public building, public facility or public park:

The subject building possesses historical significance due to its association with noted Jacksonville Fire Chief, Thomas W. Haney (1860-1939), who served from 1892 until his retirement in 1926. Under Chief Haney's leadership, the Jacksonville Fire Department evolved from a horse powered apparatus housed in a limited number of small stations to an extensive modern motorized system. Serving for over thirty years until his retirement in 1926, Haney was descended from a family of firefighters in his hometown of Atlanta, Georgia. In addition to having two brothers who were firemen, Chief Haney's father, Thomas Haney, served as the Chief of the Atlanta Fire Department. Before the age of 18, Haney joined Atlanta's volunteer fire department, and became a foreman, when a professional department was organized in the Georgia capital in 1892.

3. Whether there are any historical structures or landmarks on the subject property:

The existing firefighters museum is designated as a local landmark by City Council in 2011 via Ordinance 2011-0205 (LM-11-01).

4. Whether the existing building name, name of public facility, or public park name is part of a common theme of names throughout the community where such building, park or facility is located:

The existing museum building does not have a formally designated name and is thereby not part of a common theme of names throughout the community.

5. The age of the public building, public facility or public park name:

The existing museum building does not have a formally designated name.

6. Whether there are other public buildings, public facilities, or public parks with the same or similar name:

There are no other public buildings, public facilities, or public parks with the same or similar name.

7. Whether the person (or persons) to whom the public building, public facility or public park is proposed to be named or renamed has contributed to the development of, or is a reminder of the history and/or culture of the City, State, or Nation:

Henry J. Bradley is recognized as being the first Jacksonville firefighter to die in the line of duty. Mr. Bradley served as a volunteer firefighter for the Duval Fire Engine and Hose Company, one of Jacksonville's organized Black volunteer companies. The company was composed of 22 men. On December 16, 1885, the company joined others to fight a major fire that broke out in S.B. Hubbard's Hardware Store, a four-story warehouse, located on the south side of West Bay Street between North Main Street and North Laura Street. In addition to destroying the hardware store, the fire consumed the McConihe Building, and the Abell Block, a warehouse belonging to C.B. Benedict. While fighting the blaze, part of the front wall of the Abell Block collapsed-injuring three firemen and killing Mr. Bradley.


Mr. Bradley's passing and service to the City resulted in several fire insurance companies threatening to withdraw their coverage unless the City established a paid fire department. This demand came to fruition on April 20, 1886 when the Jacksonville City Council passed an ordinance creating a paid fire department.

## PDD Recommendation:

It is the opinion of the Planning Department that the proposed naming of the City-owned firefighters museum building located at 620 Bay Street E as the "Henry Bradley Firefighters Museum" will be named after a person that has made significant contributions to the City of Jacksonville as outlined in Ordinance 2025-XXX.

### JHPC Recommendation::

Based on the best evidence available, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission (JHPC) recommended approval of the proposed naming of the City-owned firefighters museum building located at 620 Bay Street E as the "Henry Bradley Firefighters Museum."
