Proposed ordinance's title/reference:

ORDINANCE 2025-191: AN ORDINANCE REGARDING THE PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL; AMENDING SECTION 118.104 (DEFINITIONS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO AMEND THE DEFINITION OF GRANTS ADMINISTRATOR; AMENDING SECTION 118.803 (CHIEF OF GRANTS AND CONTRACT COMPLIANCE; RESPONSIBILITIES), AMENDING SECTION 118.804 (CATEGORIES OF MOST VULNERABLE PERSONS AND NEEDS), AMENDING SECTION 118.805 (ELIGIBILITY TO APPLY FOR PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), AMENDING SECTION 118.806 (APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS), AND AMENDING SECTION 118.809 (AMENDMENTS TO PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT BUDGETS BY RECIPIENTS; APPROVAL BY GRANTS ADMINISTRATOR), PART 8 (PUBLIC SERVICE GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO UPDATE A POSITION TITLE TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE AMENDED DEFINITION OF GRANTS ADMINISTRATOR, INCLUDE THE FULL NAMES OF ORGANIZATIONS LISTED AS RESOURCES REGARDING MOST VULNERABLE PERSONS AND NEEDS, LIMIT REQUESTING AGENCIES TO ONE APPLICATION PER CATEGORY OF MOST VULNERABLE PERSONS AND NEEDS, CLARIFY PROGRAM PARTNER INFORMATION REQUESTED IN THE APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS, AND AUTHORIZE THE PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT COUNCIL TO APPROVE BUDGET CHANGES TO THE RECIPIENT PUBLIC SERVICE GRANT AGREEMENT IN EXCESS OF TEN PERCENT; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare):

This proposed ordinance would update the definition of Grants Administrator, limit applications to one per category, add wording on application regarding program partners, codify approval for budget changes over ten percent, and update organizations to include when determining reasons for selecting categories of most vulnerable persons and needs. The public purpose of the ordinance would be to improve the PSG process.
