

## **BUSINESS IMPACT ESTIMATE**

## **ORDINANCE 2026-142**

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANT AWARDS; WAIVING SUBSECTION 118.301(A)(3)(III) (EXPENDITURE OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS), PART 3 (ADMINISTRATION OF CITY GRANTS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), *ORDINANCE CODE*, TO ALLOW THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANT FUNDS AWARDED TO UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA FOUNDATION, INC. ("UFF") TO BE USED FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA BOARD OF TRUSTEES (ON BEHALF OF UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA COLLEGE OF MEDICINE-JACKSONVILLE ("UFCOM-J") AND SHANDS JACKSONVILLE MEDICAL CENTER, INC. ("SHANDS") TO SUPPORT UFCOM-J'S AND SHAND'S RESPECTIVE ACTIVITIES IN ESTABLISHING AND OPERATING A MEDICATION-ASSISTED TREATMENT CLINIC IN JACKSONVILLE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND UFF SUBJECT TO CERTAIN REVISED TERMS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare):

This Ordinance grants a waiver of subsection 118.301(a)(3)(iii) of the City's Ordinance Code to allow opioid settlement proceeds grant funds awarded to University of Florida Foundation, Inc. to be paid as contributions to the University of Florida Board of Trustees (on behalf of the University of Florida College of Medicine-Jacksonville and Shands Jacksonville Medical Center, Inc. for their respective activities in establishing and operating a medication-assisted treatment ("MAT") clinic in Jacksonville. MAT Clinics such as the one to be funded through the City's opioid settlement proceeds grant program serves one of the core strategies/functions outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding to which the City is a party that addresses authorized distributions and expenditures of opioid settlement proceeds. The settlement proceeds arose from litigation between the State of Florida and various pharmaceutical entities alleged to have contributed to the Opioid Crisis. This legislation serves the public interest in ensuring these funds are properly distributed for services to those facing opioid addiction in need of treatment.
