

RE: Request for Denial of Ord. 2025-0488 and 2025-0487; 11153 Beach Boulevard, 32246

The Greater Arlington/Beaches CPAC voted to deny Ordinance 2025-0488 and companion land use amendment 6043 for these reasons:

- 1. The land use amendment would change the land use to light industrial. The property to the north is zoned residential. The new land use would not be compatible with the adjacent residential neighborhoods.
- 2. This development would negatively impact property values because of the butchering of live animals. The operation will allow 50 poultry, 10 lambs, 10 goats, and 2 cows at any given time. Trucking in livestock would be noisy and produce terrible odors next to a residential neighborhood before the animals are taken inside the facility.
- 3. The development will detract from the quality of life in the adjacent neighborhoods by creating excessive noise and odors.
- 4. Neighbors are concerned about run-off into their wells and the contamination of the water supply.
