## RESOLUTION 2020-41-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND CELEBRATING ZETA PHI BETA AND PROCLAIMING JANUARY  $16^{\text{TH}}$  AS ZETA DAY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on January 16, 1920, on the campus of Howard University in Washington D.C., five African American women pledged to offer other women the opportunity to excel in Scholarship, Service, and Sisterhood, while exhibiting the attributes of Finer Womanhood and established the first chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.; and

whereas, since inception, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., has expanded into an international sorority with more than 600 chapters abroad. The Sorority's programs are opportunities to transform communities while serving women, children, veterans, men, and the elderly. One of the Sorority's international outreach programs is Z-HOPE (Zetas Helping Other People Excel) designed to enhance, cultivate and empower participants from all walks of life to develop and promote healthy lifestyle choices across their lifespan; and

WHEREAS, in 1943, Mamie Lucille Butler, Alpha Hayes Moore, and three others returned to Jacksonville from different Historically Black Colleges and initiated a request from the national executive board for permission to establish a graduate chapter. Thus, the Beta Alpha Zeta Chapter of the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority was chartered on April 12, 1944. The Beta Alpha Zeta Chapter became the first local African American Sorority to own a sorority house that served

as a community center. The sorority house and Zeta Park are located at 3805 Moncrief Road in the Northwest quadrant of Jacksonville. Also, the Beta Alpha Zeta Chapter became the first sorority to own and operate a child development center, first to open a Stork's Nest, and first to charter an Amicae. The Stork's Nest is an incentive program designed to promote prenatal care participation and encourage healthy behaviors during pregnancy to women in low-income households. Amicae is an auxiliary established for special friends of the Sorority that exemplifies prestige, goodwill and cooperation among women; and

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2011, thirteen dedicated women chartered the Omega Zeta Zeta Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., to primarily service the Southside and the Beaches areas in Jacksonville. The members are comprised of a dynamic group of women committed to active engagement in service, charity, scholarship, civic and cultural endeavors, as well as economic and community development initiatives. The Omega Zeta Zeta Chapter represents the diversity of Zeta Phi Beta and the importance of opportunity, service, and expansion. Over the past eight years, this chapter has accepted the challenge to inspire and motivate others in the pursuit of finer womanhood; and

WHEREAS, over the past 100 years, the National Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., membership has increased to over 125,000 college-educated, dynamic, community service driven, diverse, and professional women. Each member continues to uphold the ideals of its Founders of Service, Scholarship, Sisterhood, and Finer Womanhood; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

**Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commends the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., on their centennial celebration and proclaims January 16<sup>th</sup> Zeta Day. We extend our best
