A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING ROBERT L. "BOBBY" STEIN FOR HIS DECADES OF DISTINGUISHED SERVICE TO THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, PARTICULARLY THROUGH HIS SERVICE ON THE JEA BOARD OF DIRECTORS, AND TO THE NATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Robert L. "Bobby" Stein earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of South Carolina and spent his career founding, investing in, and growing businesses in a wide variety of industry sectors including water, sewer and waste management, real estate, oil and gas, mortgage services, highway safety, technology, food services and healthcare; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his varied business interests, Mr. Stein has been very active in civic affairs at a local and national level, serving in a variety of capacities to a number of entities and organizations, including, among others, the following: board chairman of The Better Angels Society that fundraises for documentaries by PBS filmmaker Ken Burns; member of the Florida Council of 100; board member of Guardian Catholic Schools; board member of the University of South Carolina Business School Foundation; member of the Board of Visitors of the University of Georgia School of Public International Affairs; member of the President's Intelligence Advisory Board, an independent element within the Executive Office of the President of the United States; Chair of the Defense Business

Board; ex official member of the Defense Policy Board and Defense Science Board of the Office of the Secretary of Defense; and member of the United States Naval Academy Board of Visitors; and

WHEREAS, Bobby Stein lent his considerable business acumen and experience to the City of Jacksonville through service on Mayor Alvin Brown's mayoral transition team on the Military Affairs Committee, as a member of the Jacksonville Port Authority Board of Directors, and as a member of the JEA Board of Directors for three separate terms, including serving as Board Chair during his tenure; and

WHEREAS, two of Mr. Stein's terms on the JEA Board of Directors covered momentous times in JEA's history. During his second term as a board member in the late 1990s, JEA was a founding member of The Energy Authority, a non-profit corporation headquartered in Jacksonville that has grown to represent 55 public power utilities nationwide in the sale and purchase of wholesale electricity. Stein's third term came in the aftermath of a controversy over the potential sale of JEA when a new board and management team restored the public's confidence in one of the largest public utilities in the country; and

WHEREAS, Bobby Stein has recently announced his resignation from the JEA Board of Directors and the City Council believes his history of service to be worthy of recognition; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Robert L. "Bobby" Stein for his decades of service to Jacksonville and the nation through a wide variety of activities, including multiple terms on the boards of the Jacksonville Port Authority and JEA. Mr. Stein's commitment to public service and his dedication to the betterment of our community are gratefully acknowledged and the Council wishes him the best of health and happiness in his future endeavors.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become

effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
