RESOLUTION 2025-406-A

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE MONTH OF JUNE 2025 TO BE CARIBBEAN AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in June 2005, the US House of Representatives unanimously adopted House Concurrent Resolution 71 recognizing the significance of Caribbean people and their descendants in the history and culture of the United States. On February 14, 2006, the resolution similarly passed the US Senate, and President George W. Bush issued a Proclamation on June 6, 2006, declaring June to be Caribbean-American Heritage Month in the United States; and

WHEREAS, there is no single Caribbean American identity, as the mix of vibrant cultures, languages, and religions across the United States and the islands reflects the diversity of spirit that defines the American story. Meanwhile, our countries are united by common values and a shared history, overcoming the yoke of colonialism and creating new opportunities across borders and generations; and

WHEREAS, during Caribbean American Heritage Month, we celebrate the achievements and dreams of the millions of people of Caribbean origin now living in the United States while honoring the shared history of joy and perseverance that has united and enriched life across our region for centuries; and

WHEREAS, Jacksonville, a city in which 3.5% of the population claims ancestry from one of the Caribbean countries and in which 2.2% of foreign-born persons who have become American citizens in our county came from Caribbean countries, is enlivened by the presence

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

June 2025 to be Caribbean American Heritage Month in Jacksonville in conjunction with the observances nationwide and encourages all citizens to become better acquainted with the histories, cultures, and achievements of our neighbors to the south and to enjoy all the enrichment that they have to offer our city.
