A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND THANKING JORDAN ELSBURY FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE CITY AND THE CITIZENS OF JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Jordan Elsbury, a native of Louisiana, earned his bachelor's degree in history from Southeastern Louisiana University and worked first for his alma mater and then for the Republican Party of Louisiana as a field director and regional political director before coming the Jacksonville in 2015; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Elsbury joined the mayoral campaign of then-candidate Lenny Curry as a campaign coordinator and, after the campaign proved successful, was appointed by Mayor Curry as his Director of Appointments and Special Projects. Within a year he was promoted to Director of Intergovernmental Affairs and ultimately, in January of 2020, to Chief of Staff for the Mayor's Office; and

WHEREAS, in his roles as Director of Intergovernmental Affairs and Chief of Staff, Jordan Elsbury was in constant communication with the members of City Council, explaining and advocating for the Mayor's initiatives and legislation, answering council members' questions, and generally serving as a key liaison between the legislative and executive branches of government; and

WHEREAS, in his relations with the City Council, Mr. Elsbury has

always demonstrated the highest standards of professionalism and courtesy, which stood him in good stead as he and the administration worked closely with the City Council on several particularly important and sometimes contentious issues including a referendum to extend and repurpose the Better Jacksonville Plan sales tax to pay for several billion dollars in accumulated unfunded pension liabilities, an increase in the local option gas tax to meet City infrastructure needs, dealing with the COVID pandemic, and several large capital improvement projects with the Jacksonville Jaguars, including a new Sports Performance Facility and the Kids Kampus redevelopment project; and

WHEREAS, Jordan Elsbury has recently resigned from City government to take a position in the private sector; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
