RESOLUTION 2023-519-A

A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF HEATHER RIOS, AS A MEMBER OF THE OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER GRANTS COMMITTEE, AS A PEER SPECIALIST REPRESENTATIVE, PURSUANT TO SECTION 84.202 (COMPOSITION; CITY COUNCIL LIAISON; TERMS; REMOVAL), PART 2 (OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER GRANTS COMMITTEE), CHAPTER 84 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, FOR A FIRST FULL TERM ENDING ON JUNE 30, 2026; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2023-350-E established the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee (the "Committee") to act as an advisory body for the City of Jacksonville and to review, evaluate and score grant applications to fund projects and programs aimed at combatting the opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, Section 84.202, Ordinance Code, outlines the composition of the Committee which shall consist of seven voting members, three of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by Council and three of whom shall be appointed by the Council President and confirmed by Council; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council President shall each appoint one member to the Committee from each of the following categories:

(i) Mental Health Professional, (ii) Peer Specialist, and (iii) Healthcare Professional; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Committee are chosen to provide

knowledge of needed services, shall demonstrate an interest in the impact of opioid-related programs in the community, and a willingness to participate fully in the process; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appointment. The Council hereby confirms the Mayor's appointment of Heather Rios, a Duval County resident, to the Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee, as a Peer Specialist representative, in accordance with Section 84.202 (Composition; City Council Liaison; terms; Removal), Part 2 (Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee), Chapter 84 (Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants), Ordinance Code, for a first full term expiring on June 30, 2026.

Section 2. Effective Date. This resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
