A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING THE MONTH OF MAY AS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH IN JACKSONVILLE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the City has demonstrated a commitment to mental health as a critical part of overall wellness; and

WHEREAS, one out of every 4 Americans and one out of every 6 children experience a mental health disorder; and

WHEREAS, less than 40% of those impacted by a mental health disorder receive the treatment necessary for a positive treatment outcome due to limited or no knowledge of the signs and symptoms, barriers to care, uncertainty, fear or shame; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously approved a three year long mental health awareness campaign with Hearts 4 Minds Inc. to help break the stigma of mental illness, raise awareness about the importance of mental health and connect those that need to those that provide; and

24 WHEREAS, the City will continue to take opportunities to raise 25 awareness; and

26 WHEREAS, May has been designated National Mental Health 27 Awareness Month in the United States since 1949 by the Mental Health 28 America Organization; and

WHEREAS, a focus on prevention and early intervention efforts associated with awareness could greatly reduce the number of adults and children experiencing a serious mental health condition; and WHEREAS, it is appropriate that time should be set apart each year for the direction of our thoughts toward our mental health and well-being; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

The City of Jacksonville hereby declares the 5 Section 1. 6 month of May as Mental Health Awareness Month in Jacksonville and 7 urges all citizens to join the local movement to raise awareness about mental health. Citizens are urged to join the fight against 8 9 stigma associated with mental illness and to take advantage of 10 resources and opportunities available to them to become more aware of the importance of mental health and well-being to a persons over 11 The City supports innovative approaches to 12 health and success. raising awareness, education, improving systems 13 of care and advocating for policies that support people with mental illness and 14 their families. 15
