RESOLUTION 2025-349

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING MAY 2025 AS NATIONAL FOSTER CARE AWARENESS MONTH AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO REFLECT ON THE CHALLENGES FACED BY CHILDREN IN THE FOSTER CARE SYSTEM; REQUESTING EMERGENCY PASSAGE UPON INTRODUCTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1988, President WHEREAS, in Ronald Reagan proclamation designating May as National Foster Care Awareness Month to raise awareness about the needs of children and youth in foster care, and to recognize the contributions of foster parents; and

National Foster Care Month provides an opportunity to celebrate the foster and kinship families who play a crucial role in serving as a support, not a substitute, for the parents of youth in foster care to make family unification possible; and

WHEREAS, more than 400,000 children and youth are in foster care throughout the nation; and

WHEREAS, thousands of children in the state of Florida enter the foster care system every year, often due to abuse, neglect, abandonment, or family crises; and

WHEREAS, children in foster care are much more likely to face educational instability, adverse mental health, and unfortunate misperceptions that children in foster care are disruptive, unruly, and dangerous; and

WHEREAS, the vital work of North Florida child welfare professionals is an important part of the local system of care, where they change lives, strengthen families, and inspire hope every single

day; and

WHEREAS, local non-profits provide critical resources to those in their care and are an integral part of our community; and

WHEREAS, the number of available foster and kinship families often falls short of demand, leaving many children without the stable, loving homes they need to lead healthy and productive lives; and

WHEREAS, according to available data, due to heavy caseloads and limited resources, median turnover rates for frontline caseworkers have ranged from 17 percent to 25 percent; and

WHEREAS, government, community organizations, and concerned citizens must work together to improve foster care so every child can grow up in a safe, nurturing environment; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby recognizes May 2025 as National Foster Care Awareness Month and encourages all relevant stakeholders to implement policies and take meaningful action to improve the lives of children in the foster care system.

Section 2. Requesting Emergency Passage upon Introduction

Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. Emergency passage upon introduction of this legislation is requested in order to recognize National Foster Care Awareness Month in May 2025 in a timely manner.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
