A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE APPOINTMENT OF HEATHER RIOS, AS A MEMBER OF THE OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER GRANTS COMMITTEE, AS A PEER SPECIALIST REPRESENTATIVE, PURSUANT TO 84.202 (COMPOSITION; CITY SECTION COUNCIL LIAISON; TERMS; REMOVAL), PART 2 (OPIOID AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER GRANTS COMMITTEE), CHAPTER 84 (OPIOID SETTLEMENT PROCEEDS GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, FOR A FIRST FULL TERM ENDING ON JUNE 30, 2026; REQUESTING ONE-CYCLE EMERGENCY PASSAGE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

17 WHEREAS, Ordinance 2023-350-E established the Opioid and 18 Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee (the "Committee") to act as 19 an advisory body for the City of Jacksonville and to review, evaluate 20 and score grant applications to fund projects and programs aimed at 21 combatting the opioid crisis; and

WHEREAS, Section 84.202, Ordinance Code, outlines the composition of the Committee which shall consist of seven voting members, three of whom shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by Council and three of whom shall be appointed by the Council President and confirmed by Council; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council President shall each appoint one member to the Committee from each of the following categories: (i) Mental Health Professional, (ii) Peer Specialist, and (iii) Healthcare Professional; and

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WHEREAS, the members of the Committee are chosen to provide

1 knowledge of needed services, shall demonstrate an interest in the 2 impact of opioid-related programs in the community, and a willingness 3 to participate fully in the process; now therefore

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

5 The Council hereby confirms the Section 1. Appointment. Mayor's appointment of Heather Rios, a Duval County resident, to the 6 7 Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee, as a Peer Specialist representative, in accordance with Section 84.202 8 9 (Composition; City Council Liaison; terms; Removal), Part 2 (Opioid and Substance Use Disorder Grants Committee), Chapter 84 (Opioid 10 Settlement Proceeds Grants), Ordinance Code, for a first full term 11 12 expiring on June 30, 2026.

Requesting One-cycle emergency Passage Pursuant 13 Section 2. 14 to Council Rule 4.901 (Declaration of Emergency), Part 9 (Emergency Legislation), Chapter 4 (Procedures). One-cycle emergency passage 15 of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that 16 applications for the initial Opioid Settlement Proceeds Grants cycle 17 (Fiscal Year 2023-2024) must be submitted by no later than September 18 19 30, 2023. The City Council would like to seat the Committee members 20 as soon as possible to provide the members and staff time to schedule 21 their initial organizational and training meetings to prepare for the 22 grant cycle.

23 Section 3. Effective Date. This resolution shall become 24 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 25 without the Mayor's signature.
