ORDINANCE 2025-501

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING ANNUAL TAXES FOR THE 2025 CALENDAR YEAR ON REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY LOCATED IN THE GENERAL SERVICES DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE, EXCEPTING THE SECOND, THIRD, FOURTH AND FIFTH URBAN SERVICES DISTRICTS (THE CITIES OF JACKSONVILLE BEACH, ATLANTIC BEACH, NEPTUNE BEACH AND THE TOWN OF BALDWIN); STATING THE PERCENTAGE CHANGE FROM THE 2025 ROLLED-BACK RATE; AUTHORIZING ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION; PROVIDING FOR THE USE OF REVENUES GENERATED; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Ad Valorem Tax Levy - General Services District, Excepting Urban Services Districts 2 through 5 (the Beaches and the Town of Baldwin). In accordance with Chapter 200, Florida Statutes, for the year 2025, there are hereby levied upon all taxable property located within the General Services District of the City, excepting the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Urban Services Districts (the cities of Jacksonville Beach, Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach and the Town of Baldwin), for county, district and municipal purposes, ad valorem taxes expressed in terms of mills on each dollar of assessed taxable valuation in the amount of 11.3169 mills, or \$11.3169 per \$1,000 assessed taxable value.

Percentage Change From the Rolled-Back Rate. Section 2. The 2025 operating millage rate levied herein by the Consolidated City of Jacksonville upon property within the General Services

District of the City, excepting the Second, Third, Fourth and Fifth Urban Services Districts (the cities of Jacksonville Beach, Atlantic Beach, Neptune Beach and the Town of Baldwin), represents a 4.19% increase from the 2025 rolled-back rate set forth in Resolution 2025-500-A.

Section 3. Assessment and Collection. The Duval County Property Appraiser is authorized and directed to assess, and the Duval County Tax Collector is authorized and directed to collect, pursuant to law, the ad valorem taxes levied in this Ordinance.

Section 4. Use of Revenues. The revenues raised by the ad valorem taxes levied in this Ordinance shall be utilized in the manner and for the purposes specified in the 2025-2026 budget and appropriations ordinance.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Council President.
