Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, 22 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated 23 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 24 listed in subsection (b): (The account information is attached hereto as ${\bf Exhibit}$ 1 and 25 incorporated herein by this reference) 26 27 (a) Appropriated from: 28 See Exhibit 1 \$9,002,100 29 (b) Appropriated to: See Exhibit 1 \$9,002,100 30 Explanation of Appropriation: 31 (C)

 The funding above represents an appropriation of \$9,002,100 from General Fund Operating Reserves to pay for maintenance and repairs to the John E. Goode Pre-trial Detention Facility (the "Jail"). The Jacksonville Sheriff's Office ("JSO") had a projected positive variance of approximately \$10,500,000 in the fiscal year 2022-2023 budget that will ultimately become a part of the General Fund operating reserves to offset this expenditure.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for various maintenance and repair projects for the Jail as listed on Exhibit 2, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The list is comprised of those repairs and maintenance activities the City Council and the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office have identified as necessary to address the immediate safety, health and well-being of JSO employees and incarcerated persons at the Jail.

Section 3. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2024-2025.

Section 4. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2023-505-E, adopting the 2024-2028 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to provide additional funding for the Pretrial Detention Facility - Maint & Upgrades project (the "Project"), as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 3 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to be best interests of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary delays in completion of the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the

City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this Section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2023-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan adopted by Ordinance 2023-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 5. Oversight. The Department of Public Works shall have oversight of the Project described herein.

Section 6. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that these repairs are necessary to address immediate health and safety concerns at the Jail while discussions regarding relocation, renovation and/or reconstruction of the Jail and other JSO facilities continue.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
