Paige Johnston, Office of General Counsel, explained this bill. She said that Section 951.26, Florida Statutes, requires that each county's governing body establish a county public safety coordinating council. This resolution establishes a county public safety coordinating council, for the purpose of assessing the population status of all detention or correctional facilities owned or contracted by the county and formulating recommendations to ensure that the capacities of such facilities are not exceeded. There was some discussion as to whether JSO should be charged with administering the council, or if a different entity should do it. The Chair decided to defer the bill to give the Safer Together workshops a chance to discuss it.

Mr. Wendland indicated that some companies might be deterred by such a requirement. CMs Diamond, Cumber and Bowman opposed the amendment. CM Diamond spoke about having a broad and diverse pool of job applicants, CM Bowman said that such requirements could lead companies to locate elsewhere. CM DeFoor said that it would not really be more difficult to report than any other HR data, CM Priestly Jackson talked about the importance of good jobs for Jacksonville residents. CM Dennis departed early and the hand vote on the amendment was 3-3. failed.

Clawback Language -

- Section 9.2(a) In the event reporting requirements are not met, the City will be entitled to withhold any installments of the Infrastructure Grant for any year during which any reporting requirements are not met.
- Section 9.2(b) If the Company, JAA or its affiliates fails to invest \$85,000,000 in funding by December 31, 2023, the Infrastructure Grant will be terminated and the Company will repay the City the entire amount of the Infrastructure Grant that has been previously paid to the Company, if any.
- Section 9.2(c) In the event the Company fails to retain 336 jobs and create 334 new jobs at the project location at an average wage of \$65,000 by December 31, 2026 (for a total of 670 jobs), the Infrastructure Grant shall terminate and the City shall have no obligation to pay the final \$212,500 of the Infrastructure Grant to the Company.
