20 any aircraft in the Department of Defense inventory; and

21 WHEREAS, on July 10, 2025, Naval Station Mayport held a change 22 of command ceremony where Captain Michael P. Trumbull relieved Captain 23 Brian A. Binder as Commanding Officer of Naval Station Mayport; and 24

Captain Brian A. Binder, designated a Naval Aviator 25 WHEREAS, 26 in 2000, has logged over 3,000 flight hours, served in several 27 operational assignments and deployments, including Helicopter Maritime Strike 72 (HSM) out of Jacksonville and HSM 37 out of Kaneohe 28 29 Bay, Hawaii, and participated in missions such as Operation Enduring Freedom, multinational exercises, and maritime security operations; 30 31 and

WHEREAS, Captain Binder was also assigned to the White House Drug Policy Office, where he served as the European, African, and United Nations Policy Analyst, and coordinated interagency development of the 2012, 2013, and 2014 National Drug Control Strategies, and later served as MH-60R Requirements Officer and Rotary Aircraft Branch Head at OPNAV N98; and

7 WHEREAS, in July 2022, Captain Binder began serving as the Commanding Officer for Naval Station Mayport, where he earned the 8 9 Commander-in-Chief's Annual Award for Installation Excellence, Medium 10 Fire Department of the Year, and two annual Navy Public Affairs Excellence Awards, provided exemplary leadership during emergency 11 management and disaster response efforts through hurricanes Ian, 12 Nicole, Helene, Milton, and enabled the flawless execution of 190,000 13 mishap-free flight and docking operations; and 14

WHEREAS, Captain Binder's additional awards include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Air Medal-Individual Action, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, and various unit and campaign decorations; and

WHEREAS, incoming Commanding Officer, Captain Mike Trumbull enlisted in 1994 as a Gunner's Mate, and later commissioned and qualified as a Naval Flight Officer and Weapons and Tactics Instructor; and

WHEREAS, Captain Trumbull's operational tours include USS John Hancock, Patrol Squadron Four Five, USS Ronald Reagan, Patrol Squadron Sixteen, Commanding Officer of Patrol Squadron One, Executive Assistant to the Commander of US Seventh Fleet onboard USS Blue Ridge, and Defense Threat Reduction Agency Mission Assurance Chief; and

WHEREAS, Captain Trumbull's non-operational tours include Patrol and Reconnaissance Wing Eleven, Patrol Squadron Thirty, Requirements Officer and Executive Assistant to the Director of Naval Air Warfare, Executive Assistant to the Deputy Chief of Naval

Operations for Warfare Requirements and Capabilities, and Special
 Advisor to the Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Information
 Warfare Systems/Director of Naval Intelligence; and

WHEREAS, Captain Trumbull also has numerous deployments to the
Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Fleets, conducted combat
operations, conducted intelligence surveillance and reconnaissance
operations, and held foreign submarines at risk around the world; and

8 WHEREAS, Captain Trumbull's awards include the Legion of 9 Merit, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service 10 Medals, the Air Medal, Navy Commendations, and the Naval Achievement 11 Medal; now therefore
