A RESOLUTION HONORING THE JACKSONVILLE URBAN LEAGUE FOR 75 YEARS OF SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, in 1946, a group of prominent black and white citizens, concerned with the challenges Jacksonville's African Americans faced, met to discuss establishing an organization dedicated to responding to those needs; and

from the outset, the Jacksonville Urban League has promoted equality of opportunity through the Three "E" strategy: Education, Employment and Training, and Economic Empowerment; and

WHEREAS, in the 1970's, under Clanzel T. Brown's leadership, the Jacksonville Urban League broadened its scope in meeting community needs to emphasize full employment and manpower programs; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Urban League movement is to enable African Americans, as well as other underserved communities, to secure economic self-reliance, parity, power and civil rights; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Richard Danford, Jr., who has led the Jacksonville Urban League for more than 30 years as President, and Mrs. Linnie Finley who has served as Vice-President among other capacities for more than 50 years, have worked to provide stability and access to opportunity in all they do; and

WHEREAS, our city is stronger through the efforts of the Jacksonville Urban League and their programs that address crucial issues including homelessness, unemployment, crime prevention, and support for small businesses; now therefore

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BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors the Jacksonville Urban League for more than seven decades of service to our city. Jacksonville City Council celebrates the Jacksonville Urban League's 75th Anniversary and their unwavering commitment to promoting equality in opportunity.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
