For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, 16 Section 1. within the City's budget, there are hereby appropriated the indicated 17 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) 18 19 listed in subsection (b): 20 (B.T. 24-030 attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by 21 this reference) 22 (a) Appropriated from: \$399,353.00 23 See B.T. 24-030 24 (b) Appropriated to: 25 See B.T. 24-030 \$399,353.00 Explanation of Appropriation: 26 (C) 27 The funding above is a SAMHSA grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services approved for the 28 29 Duval County Adult Drug Court program. This appropriation is comprised of funds awarded for year one of the five-30 year grant and covers the period beginning September 30, 31

2023 through September 29, 2024. No City match is required.

3 Section 2. Carryover. The funds appropriated in Section 1 4 of this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover into subsequent 5 fiscal years. The grantor allows funds to be carried over through a 6 waiver that can be requested by the Courts in the event grant funds 7 are not expended in the current fiscal year and are anticipated to 8 be spent in the next fiscal year.

9 Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in 10 Section 1 is to provide additional funds for the Duval County Adult Drug Court program. The funding will support the costs to expand the 11 substance and use disorder (SUD) treatment and recovery support 12 services of the program. The funds will allow a continuum of care 13 for those in the program, including evidence-based and population 14 appropriate prevention, harm reduction, treatment, and recovery 15 services, for individuals with SUD. Additionally, the funds will 16 allow the program to screen and assess individuals for the presence 17 of SUD and/or co-occurring substance use and mental disorders, screen 18 19 for infectious diseases for which those with SUD are at high risk. A 20 copy of the Notice of Award is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and 21 incorporated herein by this reference.

22 Section 4. Oversight. The Court Administration, Director 23 of Problem Solving Courts shall oversee the administration of the 24 Grant described herein, including providing reporting required by the 25 terms of the Grant.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
