Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Mayor's appointment of Pauline Drake as a member of the Board of Library Trustees, as an At-Large, Group 3 representative, replacing Steve Eagerton for a first full term to expire on September 30, 2026.

Background Information: The Library Board of Trustees is established pursuant to Chapter 90, *Ordinance Code*, and charged with the authority to receive, accept and exercise control over funds, property, gifts, legacies or devises now or hereafter granted to the library or its predecessor libraries and agencies for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a free public library in and for the Consolidated Government and its citizens and the responsibility for the administration of Chapter 662 and the provision of library services.

Per Section 90.101(a), *Ordinance Code*, the Board shall consist of 12 members, 2 members shall be appointed from (reside in) each of the five City Council At-Large Groups, and two members shall be appointed At-Large. At least 11 of the 12 voting members shall be citizens and residents of the County, and one At-Large voting member may be a non-resident provided that said member works in the City and is a patron of the Library. All members shall be appointed by the Mayor and subject to confirmation by the City Council.

Ms. Drake holds a bachelor's degree from Tuskegee University, a master's degree from the University of Alabama at Birmingham and a JD from UF. She served as a County Court Judge in the 4th Judicial Circuit for 21 years, and she was the first African American woman appointed as a County Judge in Duval County. Ms. Drake is on the NEFL Healthy Start Coalition board, a member of the Friends of Brentwood Library Association and a mentor for Raines High School Future Leaders and Lawyers.
