5 AN ORDINANCE REGARDING CHAPTER 745 (ADDRESSING 6 AND STREET NAMING REGULATIONS), ORDINANCE CODE; 7 RENAMING CONFEDERATE STREET EXTENDING BETWEEN HUBBARD STREET AND LIBERTY STREET IN COUNCIL 8 DISTRICT 7 TO "FRAZIER PLACE"; RECOGNIZING THE 9 ACHIEVEMENTS OF BENJAMIN MCVICKERS FRAZIER, JR.; 10 WAIVING THE REQUIREMENT OF SUBSECTION 745.105 11 (I) (2), ORDINANCE CODE, THAT THE HONOREE BE 12 DECEASED FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS; DIRECTING THE 13 LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD A COPY 14 15 OF THIS ORDINANCE, ONCE ENACTED, TO THE PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT FOR PROCESSING, 16 IMPLEMENTATION, AND COORDINATION VARIOUS CITY 17 DEPARTMENTS AND OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES AND 18 ORGANIZATIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 19

21 WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council desires to re-name 22 Confederate Street between Hubbard Street and Liberty Street in 23 Council District 7 to "Frazier Place" in honor of Benjamin McVickers 24 Frazier, Jr., a well-known journalist, civil rights legend and founder 25 of the Northside Coalition of Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, Ben Frazier, Jr. passed away on June 24, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Frazier, a Jacksonville native, was a member of the William M. Raines High School class of 1968; after graduating high school, he attended Jones Business College where he majored in Broadcast Management; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Frazier's broadcasting career spanned the

southeastern United States and included work at radio stations in New Orleans, Atlanta, New York City and Washington, D.C. and in 1979, he became the first African American news anchor at WJXT, Channel 4 in Jacksonville; and

5 WHEREAS, in 2016, Mr. Frazier founded the Northside Coalition 6 of Jacksonville, a non-profit organization whose mission is to combat 7 social, racial and economic injustice; and

8 WHEREAS, Ben Frazier, Jr. received the NAACP's Rutledge H. 9 Pearson Civil Rights Award for his contributions to civil rights; he 10 was also proud to have been invited to speak at the United Nations 11 Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination in Geneva; and

WHEREAS, the street name change from "Confederate Street" to "Frazier Place" affects the address assignment of one property owner, the City of Jacksonville, and a Small Cell Equipment locator; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Subsection 745.105(j)(10), Ordinance Code, the Planning and Development Department mailed written notifications to the affected property owners on March 14, 2024, and May 21, 2024, requesting the affected property owners to indicate their written consent or objection to the proposed street re-naming. Copies of the written notifications are attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and **Exhibit** 2, respectively; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Subsection 745.105(j)(10), Ordinance Code, the affected property owners are deemed to have consented to the proposed street re-naming due to their non-response to the written notifications; and

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2024, the 911 Emergency Addressing Advisory Committee reviewed the street name change request and voted to accept the Staff Recommendation to re-name Confederate Street between Hubbard Street and Liberty Street in Council District 7 to "Frazier Place". A copy of the minutes of the March 6, 2024, public meeting of the 911 Emergency Addressing Advisory Committee is attached hereto

as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference; and

2 WHEREAS, on March 27, 2024, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission ("JHPC") voted to adopt the Planning and 3 4 Development Department Staff Report recommending approval to re-name Confederate Street between Hubbard Street and Liberty Street in 5 Council District 7 to "Frazier Place". A copy of the JHPC agenda, 6 7 Staff Report and the excerpt minutes of the March 27, 2024, public meeting of the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission are 8 9 attached hereto as Exhibit 4 as the JHPC agenda and staff report and Exhibit 5 as an excerpt of the March 27, 2024 JHPC minutes, 10 respectively; and 11

WHEREAS, the Council finds it appropriate to change the name of Confederate Street between Hubbard Street and Liberty Street in Council District 7 to "Frazier Place"; and

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Confederate Street re-named as "Frazier Place"
Confederate Street extending between Hubbard Street and Liberty
Street in Council District 7 is hereby re-named as "Frazier Place"
by which name such street and physical location shall be hereafter
known and designated. A copy of the map of "Frazier Place" is attached
hereto as Exhibit 6 and incorporated herein by this reference.

22 Section 2. Waiver of Subsection 745.105(i)(2), Ordinance 23 Code. Subsection 745.105(i)(2), Ordinance Code, requiring that the 24 honoree be deceased for at least five years is hereby waived because 25 the Council desires to recognize the extensive accomplishments and 26 contributions Benjamin McVickers Frazier, Jr. made to the city of 27 Jacksonville and beyond within a more timely manner after his passing.

28 Section 3. Directing Legislative Services to forward a copy 29 to the Planning and Development Department. The Chief of Legislative 30 Services is requested to send a copy of this legislation, once 31 enacted, to the Addressing Section of the Planning and Development

Department for processing, implementation, and coordination with 911
 Emergency, the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department, the Post
 Office, the Traffic Engineering Division of the Public Works
 Department, and other affected agencies and organizations.

5 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become 6 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 7 without the Mayor's signature.
