Officer City of Jacksonville as authorized signatories for all correspondences concerning submission and certification of HUD Section 108 Loan Guarantee Program Application (Section 108 Loan). Section 108 Loan program is authorized by Section 108 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The program's authorizing statute and governing regulations at 24 CFR part 570, subpart M, and in particular 24 CFR 570.704(b); require applications for loan guarantee assistance submitted by entities to be accompanied by certain certifications signed by authorized representatives of metropolitan city or urban counties receiving Community Development Block Grant. The City of Jacksonville is applying for a HUD Section 108 loan for \$7,500,000 to provide a third-party loan to Armory Redevelopment Associates, LLC ("ARA"). The purpose of Section 108 financing is to cover construction costs related to the restoration of a historic building addressing adverse conditions, such as lead-based paint, asbestos, and mold, as outlined in the environmental reports. The City intends to provide Armory Redevelopment Associates with a loan of \$7,500,000 in Section 108 funds to facilitate the rehabilitation of the Armory property located at 851 N. Market Street. Financing may be utilized for rehabilitation of the base shell and core of the building, as well as replacing functionally obsolete mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems, and other essential facility equipment to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. The Section 108 Program is a significant investment by the City of Jacksonville that offers communities federally guaranteed loans to transform financially challenging projects into feasible endeavors. Only as a secondary source, the repayment of Section 108 financing will be a pledge by the City of its future CDBG funds received by HUD, and or the building as collateral. This project satisfies the Community Development Block Grant national objective for job creation and/or retention activities and is consistent with the objective cited in the City of Jacksonville's Consolidated 2019-2024 Plan for "expanding economic opportunities."


