Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Mayor's appointment of Ingrid K. Montgomery to the Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs, replacing Joseph Meux, for a partial term to expire on June 30, 2024, followed by a first full term to expire on June 30, 2026.

Background Information: The Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs is established pursuant to Chapter 82, *Ordinance Code*, and charged to serve as an advocate for the older persons in the city, to the governmental agencies responsible for the various plans and programs designed to help older persons; assist in the implementation of plans and programs selected by regional organizations, as they relate to the city and its citizens; designate priorities among programs developed in the city by public, nonprofit and private providers concerning older persons.

Section 82.101, *Ordinance Code*, provides that there are five at large members of the Council on Elder Affairs appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

Ms. Montgomery holds a bachelor's degree from Cheyney University and a master's degree in education from Temple University. She currently works for Emayay's Promise Inc. and serves on the Duval County Election Advisory Panel. Ms. Montgomery resides in Duval County in council district 8.
