7 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$2,096,681.71,  
8 INCLUDING \$1,110,573.00 FROM THE COUNTYWIDE  
9 TRAFFIC SIGNALIZATION - FIBER OPTIC PROJECT,  
10 \$700,000.00 FROM THE COUNTYWIDE INTERSECTION  
11 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT, AND \$286,108.71 FROM THE  
12 COUNTYWIDE ROADWAY SIGN STRIPE AND SIGNAL  
13 PROJECT, TO VARIOUS PROJECTS INCLUDING: (1)  
14 \$150,325.50 TO THE MONUMENT ROAD PEDESTRIAN  
15 CROSSING PROJECT; (2) \$135,783.21 TO THE ST.  
16 JOHNS BLUFF ROAD AND LOST PINE DRIVE SIGNALIZED  
17 U-TURN PROJECT; (3) \$350,000.00 TO THE GOLFAIR  
18 BOULEVARD AND APR ACADEMY PEDESTRIAN CROSSING  
19 PROJECT; (4) \$350,000.00 TO THE OVERHEAD  
20 PEDESTRIAN SIGNAL - SOUTEL DRIVE AT MORRIS MANOR  
21 PROJECT; (5) \$634,863.00 TO THE FORT CAROLINE  
22 ROAD FIBER OPTIC PROJECT; AND (6) \$475,710.00 TO  
23 THE ST. AUGUSTINE ROAD FIBER OPTIC PROJECT  
24 (COLLECTIVELY, THE "PROJECTS"), AS INITIATED BY  
25 B.T. 26-029; AMENDING THE 2026-2030 FIVE-YEAR  
26 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE  
27 2025-505-E TO REFLECT THIS APPROPRIATION OF  
28 FUNDS TO THE PROJECT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE  
29 DATE.

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31 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:



1 Optic project (collectively, the "Projects").

2           **Section 3.           Capital Improvement Plan Amendment.** Ordinance  
3 2025-505-E, adopting the 2026-2030 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan  
4 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is  
5 hereby amended to reflect the appropriation of funds to the Projects,  
6 as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets attached  
7 hereto as **Revised Exhibit 2**, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev CIP  
8 Sheets, February 2, 2026 - NCSPHS" and incorporated herein by this  
9 reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment  
10 of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be  
11 detrimental to the best interests of the community because such  
12 deferral will unnecessarily delay the commencement and completion of  
13 the Projects.

14           Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), *Ordinance Code*, enactment of  
15 this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the  
16 City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP  
17 amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute  
18 an amendment to Ordinance 2025-505-E. In all other respects, the  
19 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2025-505-E  
20 shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

21           **Section 4.           Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become  
22 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
23 without the Mayor's signature.
