RESOLUTION 2021-857-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE LIFE AND SERVICE OF JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT ENGINEER MIKE FREELAND; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Mike Freeland, a Jacksonville native and graduate of Paxon Middle School and Ed White High School, was hired by the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department as a firefighter in April of 2014; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Freeland was originally assigned to Engine 50, then assigned to Rescue 16 upon his promotion to the rank of Engineer in April 2019, and was transferred to Engine 73 at Cecil Commerce Center as a Combat Engineer in August 2021; and

WHEREAS, in the early morning hours of November 11th, a U-Haul truck crashed into a power pole near Cecil Airport, trapping the driver in the crushed cab of the vehicle. During the course of an extended extraction operation, while working in the cargo box of the truck to attempt a rescue through the back of the cab, Engineer Freeland collapsed and was immediately the subject of resuscitation efforts by his fellow firefighters, and then was transported to the hospital where life-saving efforts were ultimately unsuccessful; and

WHEREAS, the tragic death of Mike Freeland was the third death of an active-duty firefighter experienced by the Fire and Rescue Department during 2021, demonstrating the inherent dangers of the job these brave men and women perform every day and their dedication to

the public's safety and welfare; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and commemorates the life and public service of Fire and Rescue Department Engineer Mike Freeland and extends to his family, co-workers and friends its most sincere condolences on his passing. Engineer Freeland was an enthusiastic and dedicated public servant and his loss will be deeply felt by all who had the good fortune to know him. His service to the City will be long and gratefully remembered.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
