## RESOLUTION 2025-881

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE CITY COUNCIL'S STRONG SUPPORT FOR THE NOMINATION OF THE JOHN T. ALSOP JR. BRIDGE (COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE MAIN STREET BRIDGE) FOR LISTING ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES; ENCOURAGING THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT, THE JACKSONVILLE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO COLLABORATE AND PREPARE A NOMINATION SUBMITTAL; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the John T. Alsop Jr. Bridge, more commonly known to residents and visitors as the Main Street Bridge, is one of Jacksonville's most iconic and enduring civic landmarks, prominently featured in the city's skyline since its opening in 1941; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street Bridge exemplifies Depression-era engineering excellence as a steel vertical lift bridge, constructed by the Mount Vernon Bridge Company and originally funded through a combination of local bonds and federal public works funding; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street Bridge is the only remaining movable-span bridge in downtown Jacksonville and is the largest vertical lift bridge of its kind in the State of Florida, retaining a high degree of structural integrity and original design elements more than 80 years after its completion; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street Bridge has played a critical role in Jacksonville's development by facilitating transportation, supporting

economic growth on both banks of the St. Johns River, and linking neighborhoods that were once separated by water; and

WHEREAS, the State Historic Preservation Office previously deemed the Main Street Bridge eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places due to its engineering significance and contribution to Jacksonville's mid-20th century urban expansion; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street Bridge continues to serve thousands of commuters daily and has become instrumental to Jacksonville's civic and visual iconography, appearing consistently in imagery that represents the city, and serving as a defining feature of branding efforts including its prominent inclusion in the official logo for Super Bowl XXXIX, which affirmed its role as one of Jacksonville's most essential and enduring symbols; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has committed nearly \$100 million in infrastructure upgrades, including a comprehensive repainting project scheduled for 2028, to rehabilitate and reinforce the structural integrity of the Main Street Bridge, ensuring its safe operation and iconic presence for another century or more; and

WHEREAS, this substantial state investment underscores Florida's recognition of the Main Street Bridge's enduring value as a critical transportation asset and engineering landmark, compelling the City of Jacksonville to complement these efforts by pursuing listing on the National Register of Historic Places to honor its historical and cultural legacy for future generations; and

WHEREAS, listing on the National Register of Historic Places would formally recognize the Main Street Bridge's historical and cultural importance, open opportunities for preservation funding, and strengthen the City's efforts to protect and celebrate its architectural heritage; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council expresses its strong support for the nomination of the John T. Alsop Jr. Bridge (the Main Street Bridge) for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, recognizing the structure's historic and engineering significance and its role in shaping Jacksonville's civic identity.

Section 2. The City Council encourages the Planning Department, the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission, and the Department of Public Works to collaborate with the State Historic Preservation Office, the Florida Department of Transportation, and qualified preservation professionals to prepare and submit a complete nomination for listing the John T. Alsop Jr. Bridge (the Main Street Bridge) on the National Register of Historic Places.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
