Bill Summary: This bill confirms the Mayor's reappointment of Robin M. Lang to the Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs, for a second full term to expire on June 30, 2028.

Background Information: The Jacksonville-Duval County Council on Elder Affairs is established pursuant to Chapter 82, *Ordinance Code*, and charged to serve as an advocate for the older persons in the city, to the governmental agencies responsible for the various plans and programs designed to help older persons; assist in the implementation of plans and programs selected by regional organizations, as they relate to the city and its citizens; designate priorities among programs developed in the city by public, nonprofit and private providers concerning older persons.

Section 82.101, *Ordinance Code*, provides that the Council on Elder Affairs shall be composed of 19 members, five of whom shall be At-Large members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council.

Ms. Lang holds a bachelor's degree from Jacksonville University and master's degree from Strayer University. She served the US Postal Service in various capacities for 34 years. Ms. Lang resides in Duval County in council district 2.

Attendance: Ms. Lang attended 14 of 17 (82%) meetings in her first term.
