Boards and Commissions presentation

Colleen Hampsey, Council Research, discussed the review of boards and commissions as required by Chapter 50, Ordinance Code every 4 years. She listed the entities identified by council members for more assessment: Tower Review Committee, Health & Life Insurance Procurement Committee, Special Committee on Group Health Benefits, Subdivision Standards & Policy Advisory Committee, Context Sensitive Streets Standards Committee, Security and Emergency Preparedness Planning Council, and the Industrial Development Revenue Bond Review Committee.

Mary DiPerna, Chief of Compensation and Benefits, spoke to the role of the Health & Life Insurance Procurement Committee and Special Committee on Group Health Benefits and the relevance of both entities. Chair Howland said those committees were identified to make sure they were not duplicative. Ms. DiPerna indicated the committees are not duplicative and are still active and necessary. The Rules Committee opted to not take any action related to the Health & Life Insurance Procurement Committee and Special Committee on Group Health Benefits.

Connor Corrigan, Planning Department, spoke about the role of the Tower Review Committee. He talked about some of the history of the committee and infrequency of the meetings of the committee in recent years. Council Member Boylan asked about an annual reporting requirement for tower owners. After further discussion, the Rules Committee agreed that the Tower Review Committee is no longer relevant, should be sunset and the responsibilities of the body relegated to the LUZ Committee or the Planning Commission.
Motion/2nd to direct OGC to draft legislation to sunset the Tower Review Committee. Approved 7-0.

The Rules Committee discussed the Subdivision Standards & Policy Advisory Committee and the Context Sensitive Streets Standards Committee. Ms. Bannister, Planning Department, spoke about the roles, membership and composition of each committee. There was discussion about combining the two committees into one entity. The Rules Committee agreed to take no action on this item and get further information and feedback from the Subdivision Standards & Policy Advisory Committee and the Context Sensitive Streets Standards Committee members.

The Rules Committee briefly talked about the Industrial Development Revenue Bond Review Committee and whether it is still needed. Mr. Dennis, Administration, said he will report back at the next meeting as to the role and relevance of the Industrial Development Revenue Bond Review Committee. Council Member Miller also requested that Mr. Dennis provide additional information about the BJP Financial Administration Committee and the BJP Project Administration Committee.

The group discussed the Security and Emergency Preparedness Planning Council and whether it is the same group of folks that gather in times of emergency. Council Member Boylan offered to assist with gathering more information on this item.

Council Member Freeman talked about the JSEB Monitoring Committee, which was just modified through 2025-148-E. CM Freeman spoke about potential future legislation to increase the meeting frequency and level of oversight.

The Rules Committee talked about boards and commission member residency requirements. Ms. Lopera, OGC, explained the Duval residency or substantial business/philanthropic interest requirement for members specified in Chapter 50, and residency requirements mentioned in other board specific Code Chapters. The group talked about 2025-236-E, which was just approved by council and removed the Duval residency requirement from Chapter 55 for DIA Board members. There was discussion as to why this should only apply to DIA and not other boards, how Chapter 50 requirements still apply to the DIA Board, and the pros and cons of appointing non-Duval County board members.
