Appropriation. For the 2022-2023 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated 19 20 sum from the account listed in subsection (a) to the account listed 21 in subsection (b): (B.T. 23-069, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein 23 by this reference): (a) Appropriated from: See B.T. 23-069 \$500,000 (b) Appropriated to: \$500,000 27 See B.T. 23-069 (c) Explanation of Appropriation: The funding above represents an appropriation of \$500,000 of available sales revenue from the Cecil Commerce Center

Trust Fund, Gain-Loss Sale Real Property account to the

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2023 Authorized Capital Projects Fund, Cecil Piping Repair - Other Construction Costs account for the Cecil Piping Repair Project (the "Project").

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the Project in fiscal year 2022-Currently, there are two 36-inch drainage pipes that have partially caved in and are in need of repair. The Project entails repair of approximately 1,700 linear feet of pipe total (850 linear feet per pipe), between POW-MIA Memorial Parkway and Pine Links Street, at Cecil Commerce Center. The pipes carry drainage throughout Cecil Commerce Center via the leased premises known as "Cecil Pines." The City's responsibility to repair this infrastructure arises from the fact that these pipes do not specifically service the drainage needs of the property that is the subject of the Lease Agreement between the City of Jacksonville and Front Porch Communities and Services dated August 1, 2020 which states the City will maintain the main water drainage ditches located within the premises.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2022-505-E, adopting the 2023-2027 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to reflect this appropriation of funds to the Project, as more fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay completion of the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute

an amendment to Ordinance 2022-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2022-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
