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Bill Type and Number: Ordinance 2023-509

Type of Action: Appropriation; designation of oversight agency; Ordinance Code waiver

Bill Summary: The bill appropriates the sum of \$9,000,000 from the designated Council Contingency account for Public Service Grants to fund Public Service Grants for FY23-24. The bill waives the conflicting provision of Ordinance Code §118.802 (Annual Lump Sum Appropriation for Public Service Grants) due to the need for separate legislation from the annual budget ordinance to approve the lump sum appropriation for Public Service Grants. Oversight will be provided by The Office of Grants and Compliance of the Finance and Administration Department. The funds will be allocated to Prevention and Diversion programs (40%), Acute Needs (30%), and Self-Sufficiency and Stability programs (30%).

Background Information: Public Service Grants (PSG) are subject to the provisions of Chapter 118, Ordinance Code. These appropriations will be awarded as grants-in-aid to the miscellaneous agencies and will not require additional legislation for distribution of funds. Pursuant to Section 118.808, Ordinance Code, the Public Service Grant Council will forward a complete list of the Public Service Grants recipients and funding allocation to the Council Auditor's office, the Office of the Mayor, the City Council and the Director of the Finance and Administration Department. The PSG appropriation is being removed from the budget ordinance and enacted separately in order to avoid a conflict of interest situation for council members who have relationships with entities that may apply for PSG funding, who may abstain from voting on this bill while voting on the rest of the budget ordinance intact.

Policy Impact Area: Public Service Grants

Fiscal Impact: Appropriation of \$9,000,000 for public service grants, an increase of \$3,000,000 over the FY22-23 appropriation.
