## RESOLUTION 2023-289-A

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE SERVICE AND LEADERSHIP OF CULLEN CHALKER, JACKSONVILLE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT'S OLDEST FIREFIGHTER AND DISTRICT CHIEF; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Cullen Chalker was born on July 10, 1924, Jacksonville, Florida. After bravely serving our country in World War II, Mr. Chalker returned to his hometown where a job opportunity caught his eye; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Chalker scored the  $12^{\rm th}$ highest on the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department's (JFRD) employment exam out of the 150 applicants that summer, and he reported for duty at Engine 9 shortly thereafter. This was the beginning of a firefighting career that would span the next 35 years; and

WHEREAS, Cullen Chalker was an eyewitness to the unfolding of numerous historical events, and he watched as our city changed and grew. He was on the scene during the Roosevelt Hotel fire in 1963, he experienced disturbances in the city during the civil rights movement, and he witnessed Jacksonville's consolidation. The fire department evolved over the years as well, with the introduction of a third shift and the creation of the Rescue Division; and

WHEREAS, fighting fires is a dangerous profession, and fire men and women put themselves in harm's way to keep the public safe every day. Mr. Chalker had brushes with injury many times, including

once when he encountered an explosion at an appliance store at Broad and Adams Streets and thankfully survived relatively unscathed; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Chalker was promoted to District Chief in 1971, and he retired from duty in 1983 but went on to manage the Jacksonville Firemen's Credit Union for a decade afterwards; and

WHEREAS, Cullen Chalker is JFRD's oldest living firefighter and District Chief, who dedicated more than three decades of his life to public service. He loved his job, guarded his city, and he truly appreciated his colleagues in all ranks of the Department; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City of Jacksonville hereby commends retired JFRD District Chief Cullen Chalker for his years of service and leadership in the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department. The City Council extends its gratitude to Mr. Chalker for all that he did to ensure the safety of his fellow firefighters and the residents of Jacksonville.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
