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ORDINANCE 2019-766-E

ORDINANCE CONCERNING EMERGENCY MEDICAL ΑN TRANSPORTATION SERVICES; MAKING FINDINGS; DECLARING THAT PUBLIC CONVENIENCE AND NECESSITY REQUIRE THE TRANSFER OR ASSIGNMENT CERTIFICATE FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FROM **AMBULANCE** SERVICE, INC. TO AMERIPRO EMS OF FLORIDA, LLC; AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF THE FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT, OR DESIGNEE, TO TRANSFER OR ASSIGN SAID CERTIFICATE; PROVIDING CONDITIONS FOR RECERTIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONTINUED OPERATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Findings. The Council finds that:

- Ambulance Service, Inc. ("ASI") has been a private ambulance provider in Jacksonville (Duval County) for over fifty and currently provides emergency medical transportation services through a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (COPCN) issued by the City of Jacksonville, Certificate Number 99-316-A.
- Certificate 99-316-A is one of the six current COPCNs in Duval County for emergency medical transportation services.
 - (c) Certificate 99-316-A will expire on June 22, 2020.
- The original owner of ASI has decided to retire, and as a result ASI is in the process of being purchased by another private

ambulance service provider, AmeriPro EMS of Florida, LLC ("AmeriPro").

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- (e) ASI wishes to transfer Certificate Number 99-316-A to AmeriPro to allow the continuation of emergency medical transportation services to the residents of Jacksonville.
- (d) Section 158.214, Ordinance Code, provides that no COPCN "shall be assignable or transferable by the holder of the certificate except on approval by the [City] Council."
- (d) The recertification application for the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity Number 99-316-A in the name of AmeriPro EMS of Florida, LLC will be filed with the City by AmeriPro.
- (e) The City of Jacksonville will make a full and thorough review of the filing of Certificate Number 99-316-A following the recertification application pursuant to Chapter 158, Ordinance Code.
- (f) Continued operation of the emergency medical transportation services after the expiration of the current Certificate is in the best interests of the residents of the City of Jacksonville.
- (g) The continuation of services and continuity of operations is facilitated by transfer of the Certificate to a private ambulance service provider with whom the regulatory agencies of the City of Jacksonville are familiar.
- (h) The City will review all information necessary to confirm or deny the qualifications of AmeriPro to operate the emergency medical transportation services in the form of a complete and total application, pursuant to Chapter 158, *Ordinance Code*, prior to the expiration of Certificate Number 99-316-A on June 22, 2020.
- (i) The immediate transfer of Certificate Number 99-316-A to AmeriPro is necessary to allow the transition of the ASI emergency

medical transportation services to AmeriPro and to provide uninterrupted service to the community.

(j) Continued operation of the emergency medical transportation services by ASI from the date of transfer of Certificate Number 99-316-A until the service is fully transitioned to AmeriPro is in the best interests of the residents of the City.

Section 2. Transfer of Certificate. The public convenience and necessity require the transfer or assignment of ASI's Certificate Number 99-316-A to AmeriPro to operate the vehicle(s) listed in its application for emergency medical transportation services. The Director of the Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Department (JFRD), or his designee, is hereby authorized to transfer or assign Certificate 99-316-A from ASI to AmeriPro.

Section 3. Continued Operation. In order to effect a transition of the ASI emergency medical transportation services to AmeriPro without interruption to the community, ASI is authorized by the Council to continue providing the emergency medical transportation services under its previous Certificate Number 99-316-A until the transition to AmeriPro is complete.

Section 4. Memorandum of Understanding. As a condition of the transfer of the COPCN, AmeriPro will sign a Memorandum of Understanding, as authorized by Section 158.307, Ordinance Code, with the City under which AmeriPro agrees to divert its resources, as requested by JFRD, in the event of an official declaration of emergency by the Mayor during natural and other disasters to assist in meeting the imminent needs of citizens of and visitors to the City. In addition, AmeriPro agrees to participate in major sporting events as requested by JFRD. The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Jacksonville and AmeriPro EMS of Florida, LLC for Assistance for Special Events and

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Declared Emergencies, attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
