RESOLUTION 2024-963

A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING SUSAN "SUSIE" SUMMERALL WILES ON BEING NAMED THE FIRST FEMALE WHITE HOUSE CHIEF OF STAFF IN AMERICAN HISTORY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Susan "Susie" Summerall Wiles, the daughter of former NFL player and sports broadcaster Pat Summerall, graduated from Academy of the Holy Angels in Demarest, New Jersey and earned her bachelor's degree in English from the University of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, following her graduation, Ms. Wiles began a long and very successful career in political campaigning and governance as an assistant to Representative Jack Kemp of New York in 1979, then as a scheduler in Ronald Reagan's successful presidential campaign of 1980, after which she worked in the President's administration and on his 1984 campaign for re-election; and

in the 1990s Susie Wiles relocated to Northeast Florida and entered local politics where she served as Chief of Staff to Mayor John Delaney, Jacksonville's first Republican mayor elected in modern times, and as the District Director for U.S. Representative Tillie Fowler; and

WHEREAS, Wiles subsequently managed the campaign leading to the surprising gubernatorial victory of Rick Scott in 2010 and the 2011 presidential campaign of former Utah Governor Jon Huntsman before opening a lobbying and consulting firm; and

WHEREAS, Wiles returned to City Hall as the Chief Communications and Special Initiatives for Mayor John Peyton; and she returned again to City Hall as a campaign strategist and advisor during Lenny Curry's successful run for mayor, following which she was a policy director for the Mayor Curry transition team; and

WHEREAS, during her years as an advisor to and member of several mayoral administrations, Wiles was deeply involved in some of the most momentous public policy decisions and campaigns in Jacksonville's history, including the Better Jacksonville Plan, the Jacksonville Journey, the River Accord, and the sales tax referendum for pension liability funding; and

WHEREAS, after successfully managing former President Donald Trump's campaign for a return to the White House, Susie has been named the first female White House Chief of Staff, thereby cementing her place in American history; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. The City Council hereby honors and commends Susan "Susie" Summerall Wiles on her long history of significant contributions to politics and governance in Jacksonville, the State of Florida and the United States, and extends its congratulations to her upon the unique accomplishment of being named the first female White House Chief of Staff in American history.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
