NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
SPECIAL ASSESSMENT OF AHCA LICENSED HOSPITALS
FOR MEDICAID SHORTFALL

You are hereby advised that the City Council for the City of Jacksonville, Florida will conduct public hearings in the City Council Chambers on:

Regarding the proposed *Ordinance 2022-643* to assess AHCA licensed hospitals in the Consolidated City of Jacksonville. The purpose of the assessment is to fund the medical services provided by Medicaid by paying the Medicaid shortfall through the Directed Payment Program (DPP). The State of Florida will issue payment to the federal government to compensate for the non-federal share of the City/County's Medicaid payments.

A complete listing of all parcels to be assessed for the improvement is available at the Legislative Services Division, 117 W Duval Street, Jacksonville, FL 32202.

The proposed assessment **rate** is calculated based on **.21%** of your gross patient revenue.

The assessment will be against your individual parcel of property, commonly identified by Real Estate Parcel Number **152576-0250**. The parcel contains only one unit of property for the facility commonly identified as **St. Vincent's Med Center Southside** and commonly located at 1350 13th Ave S, Jacksonville Beach, FL 32250.

The amount of your assessment is **\$2,058,861.00**. The City anticipates that the assessments from all AHCA licensed hospitals will generate approximately \$44,741,737.00 to be placed in the Local Providers Participation Fund to be used only for the Medicaid shortfall requested from the City by AHCA and associated fees and costs for administration of the program.

You will be invoiced for this assessment on or around November 1, 2022, and may pay via check or automated clearing house on or before November 30, 2022. Failure to pay this Special Service Assessment will result in a tax certificate being issued against the above listed property or foreclosure proceedings may be initiated, either of which may result in loss of title to your property

Affected property owners may appear and provide testimony regarding this assessment during the public hearing. Affected property owners may also file written objections with the City Council within 20 days of the notice by mailing the written objection to Patrick Greive, Assessment Coordinator, 117 W Duval

Street, Jacksonville, FL 32202. Pursuant to Section 715.206(c), Ordinance Code, all objections must be made in writing and filed with the City at or before the public hearing.

If a person intends to appeal a City Council decision with respect to any matter considered at the public hearing, that person will need a recording of the proceedings and may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings be made, which record includes that testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.
