Justice ("DOJ"), Bureau of Justice Assistance, Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program to support various programs and activities aimed at crime control and prevention and improving public safety in Duval County. The grant period commenced on October 1, 2023 and continues through September 30, 2027. No City match is required.

7 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for various programs and activities 8 9 aimed at preventing and controlling crime and improving public safety 10 throughout Duval County. A portion of these funds will be used to support the City's Jacksonville Journey Fast Forward Crime Reduction 11 ("Fast Forward") and Intimate Violence Advanced Services 12 Team ("InVest") programs. The Fast Forward program is designed to reduce 13 crime by providing at-risk individuals with comprehensive support 14 15 that includes completion of secondary education, vocational training, apprenticeship opportunities, and employment services. By focusing 16 17 on education and skill-building, this initiative aims to empower individuals with the tools they need to lead productive, law-abiding 18 19 lives, thereby reducing recidivism and preventing first-time 20 offenses. The InVest program provides assistance to victims of 21 domestic violence through collaborative partnerships with the 22 Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, the City's Victim's Services Center, 23 and Hubbard House, a not-for-profit, domestic service provider. In 24 addition, the grant funds will be used to support contract management 25 and monitoring personnel for the City's crime prevention, 26 intervention, correction, rehabilitation and education programs.

A copy of the Grant Award from the U.S. Department of Justice dated December 4, 2024 (Award No. 15PBJA-24-GG-05344-JAGX) is attached hereto as **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference.

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Section 3. Approval of Positions. There are hereby

3 Section 4. Oversight Department. The Division of 4 Grants and Contract Compliance of the Finance and Administration 5 Department shall oversee the grant and positions described herein.
