COUNCIL RULE 4.505 DISRUPTION OF MEETING

Any person who disrupts a regular meeting of the City Council, standing committees, special or select committees, sub-committees or any other public meeting presided over by a City Council Member may be forthwith barred, removed, or otherwise ejected, in the discretion of the presiding officer, from further attendance at that meeting. If necessary, due to the nature of the disruption, the audience may be cleared from the Council Chambers or meeting location in the discretion of the presiding officer.

Any person who refuses to leave the City Council Chamber may be subject to arrest.

Disruption of a meeting includes the following types of behaviors:

- 1) Any form of political campaigning or electioneering regarding a specific candidate or group of candidates in City elections;
- 2) Impeding the orderly progress of the meeting by shouting, yelling, whistling, chanting, singing, dancing, clapping, foot stomping, snapping fingers, cheering, jeering, using artificial noise makers or musical instruments, waving signs of any size, or engaging in any other display of excessive noise, sounds, or movement;
- 3) Displaying or waving signs of any sort, except where used to support the speaker's presentation at the podium, and only where the sign is 21 inches by 21 inches or smaller in size and cannot be displayed in a manner which unreasonably obstructs the view of the dais for any member of the audience, regardless of message;
- 4) Audible noise from cellphones or other electronic devices;
- 5) Consumption of alcohol or controlled substances;
- 6) Making vulgar or offensive remarks or gestures, or using threatening language or gestures, including but not limited to pantomiming discharging a firearm, choking, or throat-cutting;
- 7) Refusing to stop speaking when his or her time has expired or is otherwise directed by the presiding officer to do so due to disruptive behavior as described herein;
- 8) Returning to the meeting after having been removed or ejected, or attempting to do so.

- Quarterly Single Source Presentation Dustin Freeman, Chief of Procurement, spoke about single source purchases. He said that this quarter, there were 18 single source purchase orders and 5 purchase order agreements.
- Public Service Grant application system issues Maribel Figueroa, Chief of Grants and Contract Compliance, spoke about issues with the Public Service Grant application software referenced at a previous meeting. Ms. Figueroa said that there was a glitch wherein some text responses were misinterpreted in the system, and she said the problem was quickly identified and mitigated. As a result of the glitch, there were 8 appeals of which 5 were approved. CM Salem asked how many grant monitors are on staff and Ms. Figueroa said there are 5 who monitor contracts, conduct site visits, receive invoices and submit quarterly reports. CM Lahnen asked about Crimestoppers, who appealed their application but did not score high enough after the appeal was granted to receive a PSG award. CM Howland asked about the permissibility of organizations receiving PSG funds and other funds from the City, particularly through direct contracts. Ms. Staffopoulos, OGC, explained the waiver process for such. CM Arias said that organizations should not continuously receive PSG funds year after year. CM Diamond said that there should be a special committee to look at nonprofit spending by the City.
- Council Auditor Kim Taylor to discuss Report #800C: Follow-up on City Wire Transfers Audit Brian Parks, Auditor's Office, reviewed the follow-up report on wire transfers. He said that the responsible parties addressed our original audit issues without exception.

Phillip Peterson, Auditor's Office, explained the NCSPHS amendments.

CM Peluso spoke on behalf of the bill. There was discussion about the amount of the assessment per property, the number of businesses who do not wish to participate, and the possibility of a sunset date. Motion/2nd CM Arias floor amendment to the NCSPHS amendment to change the appointing authority for the board of supervisors to include Mayoral appointments, so the Council President will appoint 3 members and 2 alternates and the Mayor will appoint 2 members and 1 alternate. Approved unanimously.

The NCSPHS amendment as amended was approved unanimously.

Motion/2nd CM Diamond amendment to allow for an opt out option for affected property owners. Motion/2nd CM Salem amendment to the Diamond amendment to remove 11 property owners from the district map from the onset and provide for an annual opt in or opt out period. Approved unanimously. Ms. Staffopoulos, OGC, said that a date for the annual opt in or opt out period will be added after consultation with the Tax Collector.
