5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,500,000 FROM THE PALM AVENUE IMPROVEMENTS - DM OTHER CONSTRUCTION 6 7 COSTS ACCOUNT TO THE CECIL EQUESTRIAN FACILITY - FACILITY REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS - DM OTHER 8 9 CONSTRUCTION COSTS AND DM EOUIPMENT ACCOUNTS FOR 10 THE PROJECT ENTITLED "EQUESTRIAN CENTER FACILITY REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS" PROJECT (THE 11 "PROJECT") TO FUND 12 VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS, 13 UPGRADES, AND EQUIPMENT COSTS FOR THE 14 JACKSONVILLE EQUESTRIAN CENTER AS MORE 15 SPECIFICALLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; AMENDING THE 2025-2029 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN 16 APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2024-505-E TO REFLECT THIS 17 APPROPRIATION OF FUNDS TO THE PROJECT; PROVIDING 18 19 FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE PARKS, RECREATION AND 20 COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN 21 EFFECTIVE DATE.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:
Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2024-2025 fiscal year,
within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above represents an appropriation of \$1,500,000 from the Palm Avenue Improvements - DM Other Construction Costs account to the Cecil Equestrian Facility - Facility Repairs and Improvements - DM Other Construction Costs account (\$1,230,000) and the DM Equipment account (\$270,000), to provide funding for the Equestrian Center -Facility Repairs and Improvements project (the "Project") for various improvements, upgrades, and equipment costs for the Jacksonville Equestrian Center as more specifically described herein and in **Exhibit 2**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

15 Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide City funding for various improvements, 16 17 upgrades and equipment costs at the Jacksonville Equestrian Center 18 as described in Exhibit 2. The improvements and upgrades will include, 19 but are not limited to, building repairs and enhancements, upgrades 20 to various utility and mechanical systems, installation of new 21 security and internet hardware and infrastructure, and various 22 roadway and path improvements, parking lot improvements, hookups for recreational vehicle parking and other improvements to the grounds 23 24 and property. In addition, a portion of the City funds will be used 25 to purchase upgraded signage as well as new equipment for the 26 Jacksonville Equestrian Center including a forklift and lift, an 27 additional dump wagon and general purpose tractor, and various other 28 construction and related equipment. These funds are being reallocated 29 from the Palm Avenue Improvements project that were identified during 30 the Special Committee on Duval DOGE review of the Capital Improvements 31 Plan as the Public Works Department has confirmed that project is

ready to be closed.

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2 Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2024-505-E, adopting the 2025-2029 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan 3 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is 4 hereby amended to reflect this appropriation of funds to the Project 5 as more fully described herein and in the Project Information Sheet 6 7 attached hereto as **Exhibit 3** and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment 8 9 of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be 10 detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay initiation and completion of the 11 12 improvements to the Jacksonville Equestrian Center.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2024-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2024-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

20 Section 4. Oversight. The Parks, Recreation and Community 21 Services Department shall provide oversight of the Project described 22 herein.

23 Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become 24 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective 25 without the Mayor's signature.
