Explanation of Appropriation: (C)

> The funding above represents an appropriation of \$750,000 from the Drainage System Rehabilitation - DSR General Capital Projects project to the Silver Street Drainage Improvements project (the "Project") to pay for removal and replacement of the existing storm drainpipe and inlet system on Silver Street beginning near 7th Street and ending at the outlet of Hogan's Creek in Klutho Park.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to allocate additional funds to the Silver Street Drainage Improvements project to help reduce major flooding at Silver Street and 7th Street. This transfer of funds became necessary when low bids received for the Project exceeded the available budget. This appropriation will offset the difference between the available Project budget and the low bid received and will cover the estimated costs for construction, engineering and inspections.

Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2022-505-E, adopting the 2023-2027 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to this reallocation of funds from the Drainage System Rehabilitation - DSR General Capital Projects project to the Silver Street Drainage Improvements project as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 2, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 2, Rev CIP, January 4, 2023 - Finance" and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay completion of the Project.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of

this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2022-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2022-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
