addressing the needs of Duval County's homeless and WHEREAS, chronically unhoused populations is an issue of significant concern and importance to the City and the Jacksonville community; and

Ordinance 2024-111-E established the Homelessness Initiatives Commission (the "Commission") as an advisory body of the City to assess the current unmet needs of Duval County's homeless and chronic unhoused populations and to make recommendations regarding programs, initiatives and services to be funded by the City's Homelessness Initiatives Special Revenue Fund; and

WHEREAS, Section 86.103(a), Ordinance Code, outlines composition of the Commission which shall consist of seven voting members from the general public, three of whom are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by Council and four of whom shall be appointed by the Council President and confirmed by Council who, to the extent possible, shall possess specialized knowledge about the needs of the homeless and chronic unhoused populations; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appointment Confirmation. The Council hereby confirms the Council President's appointment of Dr. Megan Allyse, a

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Duval County resident, as a member of the Homelessness Initiatives Commission, in accordance with Section 86.103, *Ordinance Code*, for an initial three-year term expiring February 28, 2027.

Section 2. Requesting One Cycle Emergency Passage Pursuant to Council Rule 4.901 Emergency. One cycle emergency passage of this legislation is requested. The nature of the emergency is that there is an urgent need for the Commission to be fully seated as soon as possible so that it can commence its work in a timely manner, including development of an annual Action Plan by September 1st as required in Section 86.104, Ordinance Code.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective without the Mayor's signature.
