The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant funding (\$544,427.00) from the Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance to the City of Jacksonville (COJ) provides for crime reduction activities and improvement of public safety in Duval County.

This funding does not require a match and is available through the period of October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2026. Funding will support the following: (1) DAWN program that works with adults, ages 18 and over, incarcerated in Jacksonville Sheriff's Office facilities and provides GED and Adult Basic Education instruction, life skills training, and transitional counseling classes. DAWN also provides access to job training and soft skills necessary for successful reentry. Students leave the program with respect and responsibility for themselves and the community; (2) COJ's InVEST Program, which provides domestic violence victim services; and (3) Contract management and monitoring personnel for the City's crime prevention, intervention, correction, rehabilitation, and education programs.
