ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS AND AN APPROPRIATING \$8,000,000 MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH DEBT SERVICE SAVINGS FROM THE REFINANCING OF BONDS TO BE USED FOR VARIOUS PROJECTS AND COSTS FOLLOWS: (1) \$2,500,000 TO JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY FOR THE NEWLY ESTABLISHED COLLEGE OF (2) \$1,500,000 TO THE DUVAL SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS OFFICE FOR UNBUDGETED ELECTION COSTS, (3) \$1,000,000 TO FUND THE BREEZE AIRWAYS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT, (4) \$975,000 TO THE FLORIDA THEATRE FOR CAPITAL REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE, (5) \$669,581 FOR DOWNTOWN PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION PROGRAM LOAN DISBURSEMENTS PURSUANT TO THE REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DOWNTOWN INVESTMENT AUTHORITY ("DIA") AND JWB REAL ESTATE CAPITAL, LLC, AS AUTHORIZED AND APPROVED IN ORDINANCE 2022-30-E, (6) \$450,000 FOR EXTENSION OF AND IMPROVEMENTS TO CATHERINE STREET AND ADJACENT **AREAS** ΤO ACCOMMODATE THE NEWLY RELOCATED FIRE MUSEUM, (7) \$330,419 TO SPECIAL RESERVE COUNCIL CONTINGENCY FOR **FUTURE** APPROPRIATION, (8) \$300,000 FOR THE RETENTION POND SAFETY CAMPAIGN, (9) \$250,000 FOR RECYCLING EDUCATION, AND (10) \$25,000 TO THE SPRINGFIELD

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PRESERVATION AND REVITALIZATION COUNCIL, INC. ("SPAR") TO CONDUCT A SPRINGFIELD AREA PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT STUDY, AS INITIATED BY REVISED B.T. 22-071; PURPOSE OF APPROPRIATION; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY PROVIDE FUNDING FOR ESTABLISHMENT AND OPERATION OF THE JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF LAW; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH JACKSONVILLE UNIVERSITY; APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR HIS DESIGNEE, AND THE CORPORATION SECRETARY TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF JACKSONVILLE AND SPAR TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR A SPRINGFIELD AREA PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT STUDY; INVOKING THE EXCEPTION IN SECTION 126.107(G), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH SPAR TO PAY THE COSTS OF THE SPRINGFIELD AREA PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT STUDY; WAIVING SECTION 118.107 (NONPROFITS TO RECEIVE FUNDING THROUGH A COMPETITIVE EVALUATED AWARD PROCESS), PART 1 (GENERAL PROVISIONS), CHAPTER 118 (CITY GRANTS), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ALLOW A DIRECT CONTRACT WITH SPAR; AMENDING THE 2022-2026 FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2021-505-E TO APPROPRIATE DEBT

SERVICE SAVINGS TO THE FLORIDA THEATRE FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS AND MET PARK MARINA FIRE STATION, MUSEUM & DOCK/DESIGN (REPLACEMENT) PROJECTS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

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Findings. It is hereby ascertained, determined, Section 1.

(a) The authorizations provided by this Ordinance are for public uses and purposes for which the City may use its powers as a county, municipality and as a political subdivision of the State of Florida to expend public funds, and the necessity in the public interest for the provisions herein enacted is hereby declared as a matter of legislative determination.

Section 2. Appropriation. For the 2021-2022 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

Explanation of Appropriation: (C)

> The funding above represents an appropriation of \$8,000,000 made available through debt service savings from the refinancing of bonds to be used for various projects and costs as follows: (1) \$2,500,000 to Jacksonville University for the newly established College of Law in downtown

Jacksonville; (2) \$1,500,000 to the Duval County Supervisor of Elections Office for unbudgeted election costs in fiscal year 2021-2022; (3) \$1,000,000 to fund an economic development agreement with Breeze Airways for initial marketing efforts to establish new/additional flight routes to/from Jacksonville International Airport; \$975,000 to the Florida Theatre for elevator repairs and other capital repairs and maintenance; (5) \$450,000 for extension of and improvements to Catherine Street and adjacent areas to accommodate access to the newly relocated Fire Museum; (6) \$669,581 for future Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program Loans payments to JWB Real Estate Capital, LLC for renovations and rehabilitation of the Thomas V. Porter House as authorized and approved by Ordinance 2022-30-E; (7) \$330,419 to the Special Council Reserve Contingency Fund for future appropriation by the City Council; (8) \$300,000 for the retention pond safety campaign; (9) \$250,000 for recycling education; and (10) \$25,000 to the Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council, Inc. ("SPAR").

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Section 3. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 2 is to pay for various projects and costs as outlined above. The appropriation to the Duval County Supervisor of Elections Office is necessary to cover the costs associated with the unexpected, unbudgeted election for the Group 3 At-Large City Council seat in fiscal year 2021-2022. This appropriation also includes payment of \$2,500,000 to Jacksonville University to fund the first half of the City's commitment to provide a total of \$5,000,000 toward establishment and operation of a new College of Law in downtown Jacksonville. In addition, \$1,000,000 will be paid to Breeze Airways as part of an economic development agreement that will be presented

subsequent legislation for City Council approval. appropriation also includes \$669,581 for Downtown Preservation and Revitalization Program Loan disbursements to be made pursuant to the Redevelopment Agreement between the DIA and JWB Real Estate Capital, LLC, for certain improvements to renovate and rehabilitate the Thomas V. Porter House Building, located at 510 N. Julia Street, authorized and approved in Ordinance 2022-30-E. A portion of the funds will be used to offset costs for repairs to the Florida Theatre elevators and other capital repairs and maintenance at that facility, and for improvements to Catherine Street and areas surrounding the newly relocated Fire Museum. Finally, a portion of the funds will be used for recycling and retention pond safety and educational campaigns and to fund a planning and development study for the Springfield Historic District, with the remaining \$330,419 being appropriated to the Special Council Contingency Reserve Activity.

Section 4. Carryover. The funds appropriated in this Ordinance shall not lapse but shall carryover to fiscal year 2023-2024 with the exception that those funds appropriated to the Duval County Supervisor of Elections Office and the Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council, Inc. shall be encumbered and expended in fiscal year 2021-2022.

Agreement Between the City and Jacksonville University ("JU"). The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, a funding agreement with JU in an amount not-to-exceed \$2,500,000 for establishment and operation of the new Jacksonville University College of Law to be located in downtown Jacksonville, as more fully described in Exhibit 2, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and all other contracts, memorandums of understanding and documents, including extensions, renewals or amendments thereto,

and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal review and approval by the Office of General Counsel and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

Section 6. Waiving Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract between the City of Jacksonville and Jacksonville University. JU is a non-profit organization and is establishing a new College of Law in downtown Jacksonville. The City finds that this direct contract is justified because JU intends to make a significant investment in downtown Jacksonville to establish this new college to meet a pressing need for quality legal education in northeast Florida.

Agreement Between the City and Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council, Inc. ("SPAR"). The Mayor, or his designee, and the Corporation Secretary are hereby authorized to execute and deliver, for and on behalf of the City, a grant agreement with SPAR in an amount not-to-exceed \$25,000 to procure the services of the Urban Land Institute to conduct a planning and development study ("Technical Assistance Panel") of the Springfield Historic District as more fully described in Exhibit 3, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and all other contracts, memorandums of understanding and documents, including extensions, renewals or amendments thereto, and to otherwise take all action necessary to effectuate the intent of this Ordinance, subject to appropriate legal

review and approval by the Office of General Counsel and the City's Risk Management Division for appropriate insurance and indemnification requirements in accordance with Section 128.601, Ordinance Code.

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Section 8. Invoking the exception to Section 126.107(g), Ordinance Code. The City is hereby authorized to direct contract with Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council, Inc., for the completion of a planning and development study by the Urban Land Institute for the Springfield Historic District. Pursuant to Section 126.107(g) (Exemptions), Part 1 (General Regulations), Chapter 126 (Procurement Code), Ordinance Code, such procurement is exempted from competitive solicitation because the supplies or services are to be provided by those specifically prescribed within authorizing legislation that appropriates the same. With the exception of the foregoing, all other provisions of Chapter 126, Ordinance Code, shall remain in full force and effect.

Waiving Section 118.107, Ordinance Code. Section 9. The provisions of Section 118.107 (Nonprofits to receive funding through a competitive evaluated award process), Part 1 (General Provisions), Chapter 118 (City Grants), Ordinance Code, are hereby waived to allow for a direct contract between the City of Jacksonville and Springfield Preservation and Revitalization Council, Inc. SPAR is a non-profit organization whose mission is to preserve the character and historic nature and fabric of the Springfield Historic District while also facilitating improvements to the quality of life of its residents and The City finds that this direct contract is justified businesses. because SPAR intends to use the funds to pay for a planning and development study by the Urban Land Institute that will help guide future development in the Springfield Historic District. This will assist SPAR and the City in identifying civil infrastructure deficiencies and improvement opportunities in the district, as well

as appropriate residential densities and land uses, and will be used to help direct business development to appropriate commercial corridors and nodes within the Historic District.

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Section 10. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment. Ordinance 2021-505-E, adopting the 2022-2026 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is hereby amended to appropriate funds to the Florida Theatre Facility Improvements and the Met Park Marina Fire Station, Museum & Dock/Design (Replacement) projects for elevator replacement and other capital repairs and maintenance at the Florida improvements to Catherine Street to accommodate the newly relocated Fire Museum, as more fully described in the Project Information Sheets attached hereto as Revised Exhibit 4, labeled as "Revised Exhibit 4, Rev CIP, May 16, 2022 - NCSPHS and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests of the community because such deferral will unnecessarily delay these projects and could lead to increased construction costs due to market volatility. In addition, the capital repairs and replacements at the Florida Theatre will ensure the continued safe operation and maintenance of that public facility by addressing the most pressing capital improvement needs of the Theatre.

Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), Ordinance Code, enactment of this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute an amendment to Ordinance 2021-505-E. In all other respects, the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2021-505-E shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

Section 11. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become
