A RESOLUTION REQUESTING A WRITTEN ADVISORY OPINION FROM THE FLORIDA COMMISSION ON ETHICS (THE "COMMISSION") PURSUANT TO RULE 34-6.004, FLORIDA ADMINISTRATIVE CODE, AND 112.322(3)(A), FLORIDA STATUTES, REGARDING THE APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER 112, PART III, FLORIDA STATUTES OR ANY OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED TO STANDARDS OF CONDUCT FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT ATTORNEYS AND PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES, REGARDING THE HIRING OF THE LAW FIRM OF GENERAL COUNSEL MICHAEL FACKLER'S FATHER-IN-LAW TO REPRESENT THE CONSOLIDATED CITY GOVERNMENT AND THE DUVAL COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD; DIRECTING THE OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL TO PROVIDE A LEGAL MEMORANDUM PROVIDING RELEVANT FACTS AND LEGAL ANALYSIS; DIRECTING THE OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL TO FORWARD A COPY OF THE RESOLUTION AND LEGAL MEMORANDUM TO THE COMMISSION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Request for a Written Advisory Opinion from the Florida Commission on Ethics. The City Council hereby submits a request to the Florida Commission on Ethics (the "Commission"), pursuant to Section 112.322(3)(a), Florida Statutes, for a written advisory opinion regarding the applicability of Chapter 112, Part III, Florida Statutes, or any other statutory restrictions concerning

Prepare a Legal Memorandum. The Office of General Counsel is hereby directed to draft and attach a legal memorandum to this Resolution prior to the Council taking final action on this legislation, providing the relevant facts and background and any legal analysis the City would request the Commission consider in providing a written advisory opinion on the matter described above.

Section 3. Direction to Forward the Resolution and Legal Memorandum to the Florida Commission on Ethics. The Office of General Counsel is hereby directed to forward this request in the form of the enacted Resolution and the legal memorandum described in Section 2 to the Florida Commission on Ethics.

Section 4. **Effective Date.** Pursuant to Section 6.05(e) of the Charter, this Resolution shall become effective upon adoption by the Council.
