7 A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMEMORATING THE  
8 LIFE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF HARRY FRISCH AND  
9 EXTENDING CONDOLENCES TO HIS FAMILY, FRIENDS,  
10 AND MANY ADMIRERS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE  
11 DATE.

13 **WHEREAS**, Hans "Harry" Frisch was born in Vienna, Austria in  
14 1923, fled the incoming Nazi regime with his family in 1928 through  
15 Czechoslovakia to Palestine and, after running a successful auto  
16 repair shop in the new nation of Israel, immigrated to the United  
17 States in 1953 to reunite with his family who had moved to America  
18 several years earlier; and

19 **WHEREAS**, when he arrived in the Unites States, Mr. Frisch came  
20 to Jacksonville where his mother, stepfather and brother had  
21 started a fish market on Beaver Street that over the years has  
22 grown into the Beaver Street Fisheries empire we know today; and

23 **WHEREAS**, through hard work, honest dealing and the application  
24 of good common sense, Harry Frisch and his parents, brother, sons  
25 and now grandchildren have grown the family's small business into  
26 an international seafood supplier, employing more than 400 people  
27 in the United States and in the Bahamas and shipping seafood and  
28 other foods and supplies across the country and around the world to  
29 more than 50 countries. He exercised the wisdom of "using your  
30 head" and made personal relationships with and commitment to both  
31 his customers and his employees the foundation of his business

1 success; and

2 **WHEREAS**, concurrent with his great success as a businessman,  
3 Mr. Frisch was extremely active in civic affairs and philanthropic  
4 endeavors, returning a great share of his success to his adopted  
5 community through such ventures as the Jacksonville Farmer's  
6 Market, through the Beaver Street Foundation which supports  
7 numerous not-for-profits serving the needs of the Jacksonville  
8 community, and his service on the boards of Etz Chaim Synagogue and  
9 the River Garden Foundation; and

10 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Frisch was the recipient of countless awards and  
11 honors over the years in recognition of his investment in and  
12 devotion to time and talent to the community. Just a small sampling  
13 includes the First Coast 50 Award by KPMG, the Thomas S. Baker  
14 SOLID AS A ROCK Award by Junior Achievement, induction into the  
15 First Coast Business Hall of Fame by the Florida Council on  
16 Economic Education, receipt of the Humanitarian Award Silver  
17 Medallion from OneJax, and the Service to Agriculture Award by the  
18 Duval County Farm Bureau; and

19 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Frisch was a legendary figure in Jacksonville's  
20 business and civic circles and his recent passing at the age of 99  
21 will leave a vacant spot in the fabric of our community; now  
22 therefore

23 **BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

24 **Section 1.** The City of Jacksonville hereby honors and  
25 commemorates the life and accomplishments of Hans "Harry" Frisch on  
26 the occasion of his passing and extends to his family, friends, and  
27 many admirers the City Council's sincere condolences on his  
28 passing. His example of hard work, honest dealing and civic spirit  
29 stand as a model for responsible leadership and corporate  
30 engagement, and his life and legacy will be long and gratefully  
31 remembered.

1           **Section 2.           Effective Date.**   This Resolution shall become  
2 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective  
3 without the Mayor's signature.
