WHEREAS, Mr. Taylor has created the "Rhythmic Reading with Rap" series using hip-hop to help students learn reading fundamentals though music and art; and he produced and developed the song "I AM A TEACHER," to support the great work of people who chose this profession, and the song has become a viral sensation gaining thousands of views on social media; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taylor has founded impactful programs such as The Young Gentlemen Group, which has evolved into The Young Ladies & Young Gentlemen Club, a school-based mentorship initiative designed to support emerging leaders at the school, and TriEclipse Publishing, Inc., which extends his educational influence beyond the classroom; and

WHEREAS, his expertise has been showcased at numerous national conferences and professional development sessions, where he has trained over 50,000 educators across the United States; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Taylor's accomplishments include receiving the 2022 NAACP Olivia Gay-Davis Award, the 2021 Literacy Legacy Award, and mayoral recognition in 2014 for his mentorship program, highlighting his significant contributions to education and the Jacksonville community; and
