Resolution 2022-716-A was approved on 10/11/22, authorizing a \$5,300,000 Recapture Enhanced Value Program Grant approving and authorizing the execution of documents by the Mayor and Corporate Secretary to support the expansion of JAX LNG, LLC to expand its existing natural gas liquefaction and storage facility, with an anticipated private capital investment of \$113,000,000 and create 10 permanent full-time equivalent jobs. The purpose of the grant is to support the proposed expansion of JAX LNG investing \$113 million to expand their plant. The REV Grant incentive is a material factor in the proposed expansion. The project is located at 9225 Dames Point Road, Jacksonville, FL32226. The project is in compliance with the City of Jacksonville Public Investment Policy.

The original Economic Development Agreement dated 12/12/22 provided for a completion date of 12/31/26 and provided for time extensions up to 1 year. The company experienced several delays, resulting primarily from the Covid-19 outbreak delaying construction, delivery and availability of machinery and equipment and building materials. Additionally delaying the construction of LNG fueled marine vessels which are expected to be fueled in the southeast (including JAX Port), but due to the COVIC disruptions, these vessels have been substantially delayed. Unfortunately, these circumstances have rendered commencement of construction by June 30, 2024 impossible.

These delays have also resulted in an increase in construction costs and machinery and equipment costs. The cost of the expansion project has increased from \$113 million to \$124 million. The cost breakdown for construction is now \$66 million versus \$60 million and machinery and equipment costs are now \$58 million versus \$53 million. As a result, this Amendment Three is being requested to allow time to adjust to the delays and request the following time extensions.

- One year extension from commencement of construction from June 30, 2024, to June 30, 2025; and
- One year to complete construction from December 31, 2027, to December 31, 2028; and

• One year extension for the creation of 10 new full-time jobs from December 31, 2028, to December 31, 2029, at an average wage of \$70,0000 per year, plus benefits.
