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**ORDINANCE 2024-697** 

AN ORDINANCE REGARDING INSTALLATION OF A HISTORIC MONUMENT MARKER IN HONOR OF MRS. JOHNNIE MAE CHAPPELL; APPROPRIATING \$10,000 FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S DESIGNATED CONTINGENCY TO THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES - OFFICE OF THE DIRECTOR, MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES AND CHARGES ACCOUNT TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE DESIGN, FABRICATION, INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF A HISTORIC MONUMENT MARKER AS DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR CARRYOVER OF FUNDS TO DECEMBER 31, 2024; PROVIDING FOR REVERTER OF FUNDS; AUTHORIZING INSTALLATION OF A HISTORIC MONUMENT MARKER AT THE INTERSECTION OF NEW KINGS ROAD AND FLICKER AVENUE TO REMEMBER AND HONOR MRS. JOHNNIE MAE CHAPPELL; FINDING A PUBLIC PURPOSE; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; DIRECTING THE LEGISLATIVE SERVICES DIVISION TO FORWARD A COPY OF THIS ORDINANCE, ONCE ENACTED, TO THE DIRECTORS OF THE PARKS, RECREATION AND COMMUNITY SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Jacksonville City Council wishes to fund the installation of a Historic Monument Marker in honor of Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell, a beloved wife, mother and friend who was killed on the evening of March 23, 1964, near the intersection of New Kings Road and Flicker Avenue during a month marked by racial violence in the city of Jacksonville; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the late Johnnie Mae Chappell is worthy and deserving of a form of recognition that the City of Jacksonville and Mrs. Chappell's descendants can share and acknowledge in, to wit: the creation and installation of a Historic Monument Marker at the intersection of New Kings Road and Flicker Avenue in Council District 10; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

Section 1. Appropriation. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s) listed in subsection (b):

(c) Explanation of Appropriation:

The funding above is an appropriation of \$10,000 from the Council President's Designated Contingency to the Parks, Recreation and Community Services - Office of the Director, Miscellaneous Services and Charges account to provide funds for the design, fabrication, installation and maintenance of a Historic Monument Marker to be placed near the intersection of New Kings Road and Flicker Avenue in honor of Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell.

Section 2. Purpose. The purpose of the appropriation in Section 1 is to provide funding for the design, fabrication and

installation of a Historic Monument Marker (the "Marker") as described herein. These funds will cover the costs of materials necessary for the creation and installation of the Marker as well as costs for its maintenance.

Section 2. Carryover. The funds appropriated herein shall not lapse but shall carryover to December 31, 2024.

Section 3. Reverter. Any funds remaining after completion of the project described herein shall be returned to the account of origin by January 31, 2025.

Marker in Honor of Johnnie Mae Chappell. A Historic Monument Marker recognizing and honoring the life and untimely death of Mrs. Johnnie Mae Chappell that occurred on March 23, 1964, shall be placed in the appropriate location at the intersection of New Kings Road and Flicker Avenue in Council District 10. The precise wording to be etched on the Marker is attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 5. Finding of Public Purpose. The City finds that the proposed use of City funds for the Marker accomplishes a public benefit by providing a Historic Monument Marker that will be viewable to the public.

Section 6. Oversight. The Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department and the Department of Public Works shall oversee the project described herein.

Section 7. Directive to Legislative Services Division. The Legislative Services Division is hereby requested to send a copy of this legislation, once enacted, to the Director of the Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department and the Director of the Department of Public Works.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective

without the Mayor's signature.
