5 AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING A \$20,000,000 GRANT
6 AWARDED BY THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF
7 ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ("FDEP") FOR THE
8 LASALLE STREET OUTFALL PROJECT, AS INITIATED BY
9 B.T. 23-005; AMENDING THE 2023-2027 FIVE-YEAR
10 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN APPROVED BY ORDINANCE
11 2022-505-E TO REFLECT FDEP GRANT FUNDING FOR THE
12 PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR OVERSIGHT BY THE PUBLIC
13 WORKS DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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15 **BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Jacksonville:

16 **Section 1. Appropriation.** For the 2022-2023 fiscal year,
17 within the City's budget, there is hereby appropriated the indicated
18 sum(s) from the account(s) listed in subsection (a) to the account(s)
19 listed in subsection (b):

26 (c) Explanation of Appropriation:

27 The funding above represents an appropriation of grant
28 funding in the amount of \$20,000,000 from the State of
29 Florida Department of Environmental Protection ("FDEP")
30 for the Lasalle Street Outfall project (the "Project").
31 The City's match of \$20,000,000 for the Project was

1 appropriated by Ordinance 2022-504-E.

2 **Section 2. Purpose.** The purpose of the appropriation in
3 Section 1 is to provide funding to construct drainage improvements
4 in the San Marco area to alleviate roadway flooding caused by heavy
5 rainfall and high tides. The Project entails installation of an
6 improved stormwater pump station with a backup generator and
7 collection system at Lasalle Street and San Marco Boulevard. A force
8 main pipe will also be installed that extends from the pump station
9 to the St. Johns River. This Project is intended to reduce the
10 frequency and severity of flooding in the San Marco area. A copy of
11 the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection Standard
12 Grant Agreement (Agreement Number: 22FRP100) providing the terms and
13 conditions relative to receipt and expenditure of the grant funds has
14 been placed **On File** with the Office of Legislative Services.

15 **Section 3. Capital Improvement Plan Amendment.** Ordinance
16 2022-505-E, adopting the 2023-2027 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan
17 (the "CIP") for the City and certain of its independent agencies, is
18 hereby amended to reflect FDEP grant funding for the Project as more
19 fully described in the Project Information Sheet attached hereto as
20 **Exhibit 2** and incorporated herein by this reference. The City Council
21 finds that the deferral of this amendment of the CIP until the next
22 annual budget and CIP review will be detrimental to the best interests
23 of the community because such deferral will result in unnecessary
24 delay of the Project and loss of grant funding for the Project.

25 Pursuant to Section 122.605(c), *Ordinance Code*, enactment of
26 this Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the
27 City Council members present at the meeting because of the CIP
28 amendment set forth in this section. This Ordinance shall constitute
29 an amendment to Ordinance 2022-505-E. In all other respects, the
30 Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan approved by Ordinance 2022-505-E
31 shall remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

1 **Section 4. Oversight.** The Public Works Department shall
2 oversee administration of the grant and the Project described herein.

3 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become
4 effective upon signature by the Mayor or upon becoming effective
5 without the Mayor's signature.
